



The majority (85%) of Latin American & Latino Studies BA degree graduates had plans to pursue graduate education.




Types of Academic Degrees



The majority (77%) of graduates with a Latin American & Latino Studies Major plan to obtain either a Masters degree or PhD.




UCSC Latin American & Latino Studies BA Graduates Most Popular Field of Future Academic Study




UCSC Latin American & Latino Studies BA Graduates Employment Plans


Over half (51%) of graduates with a BA degree in Latin American & Latino Studies reported being employed within 6 months of graduation.



SocSci Division (excluding LALS Major)




UCSC Latin American & Latino Studies BA Graduates Employed vs Seeking Employment

Of those employed, 60% of Latin American & Latino Studies BA graduates reported working in the Education sector within 6 months of graduation.






UCSC Latin American & Latino Studies BA Graduates Median Annual Salary



Fifty percent of graduates with a BA degree in Latin American & Latino Studies reported earning \$29,232 annually or higher within 6 months of graduation.




UCSC Latin American & Latino Studies BA Graduates Future Career Plans



42% of Latin American & Latino Studies BA graduates hoped to have a career in Education & Training after completing their education.




Geographic destinations of those with a job






More than half (57%) of Latin American & Latino Studies BA graduates reported that they plan to work locally in the Santa Cruz or San Francisco Bay Area.




UCSC Latin American & Latino Studies BA Graduates When did they start looking for a job? (employed & seeking employment)





How many job offers did they receive?





Of those employed, one-third (33%) of graduates with a BA degree in Latin American & Latino Studies received more than one job offer.
