Types of Academic Degrees







Most Popular Field of Future Academic Study





The majority (82%) of Business Management Econ BA graduates were interested in pursuing advanced degrees in Business, Management, and Marketing.










More graduates with a BA degree in Business Management Econ were employed than seeking employment 6 months after graduation.



Sectors where students were employed














Median Annual Salary



The majority (71%) of Business Management Econ BA graduates hoped to have a career in Business Management & Administration after completing their education.




Geographic Destinations






When did they start looking for a job?






Over half (59%) of Business






Of those employed, 48% of graduates with a BA degree in Business Management Econ received multiple job offers.
