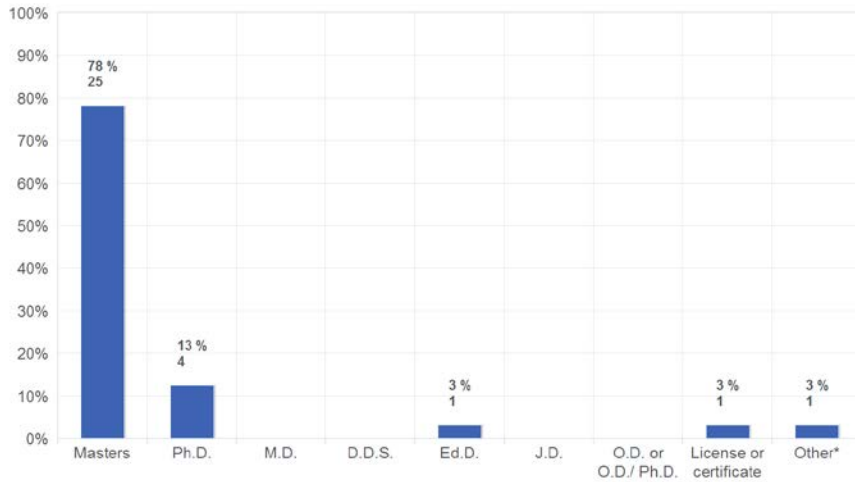

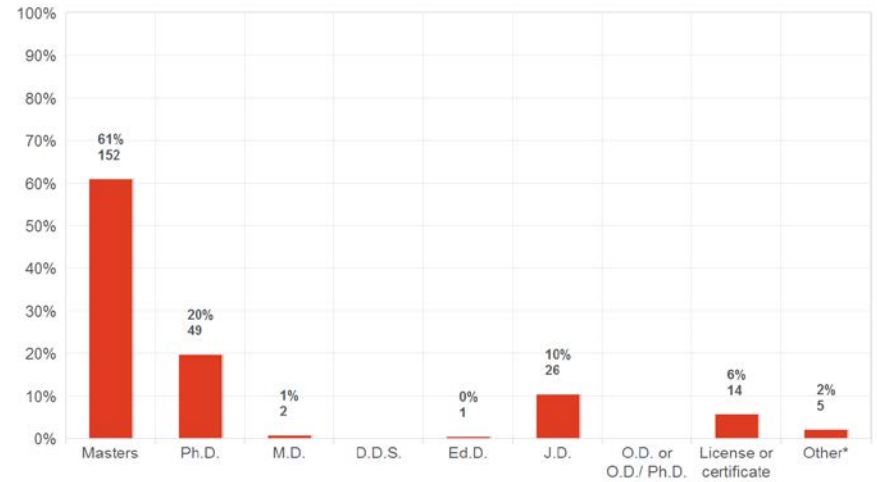
About three-quarters (70%) of Language Studies BA graduates had plans to pursue graduate education.

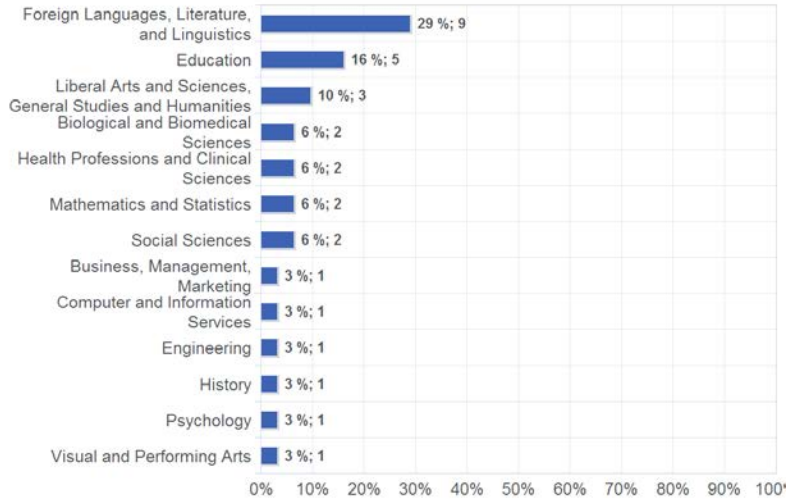

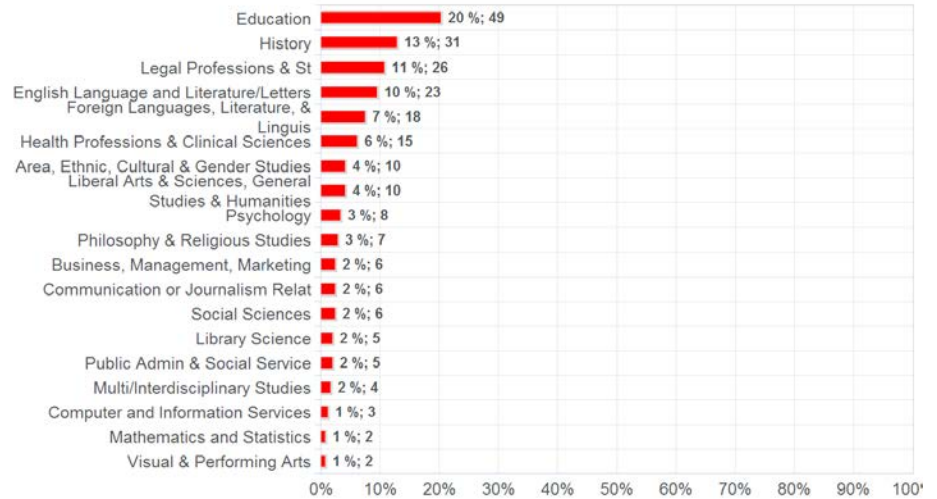
Nearly all (91%) graduates with a Language Studies Major had plans to obtain a Masters degree or PhD.

Most Popular Field of Future Academic Study



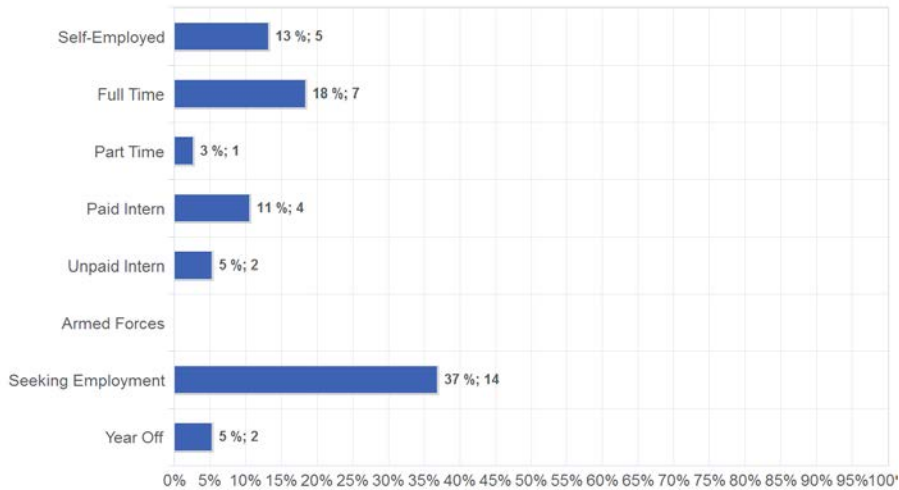

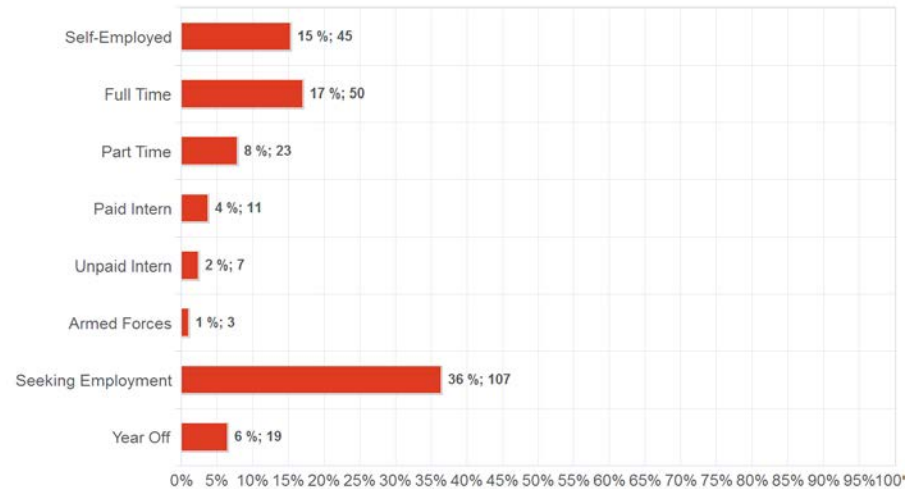

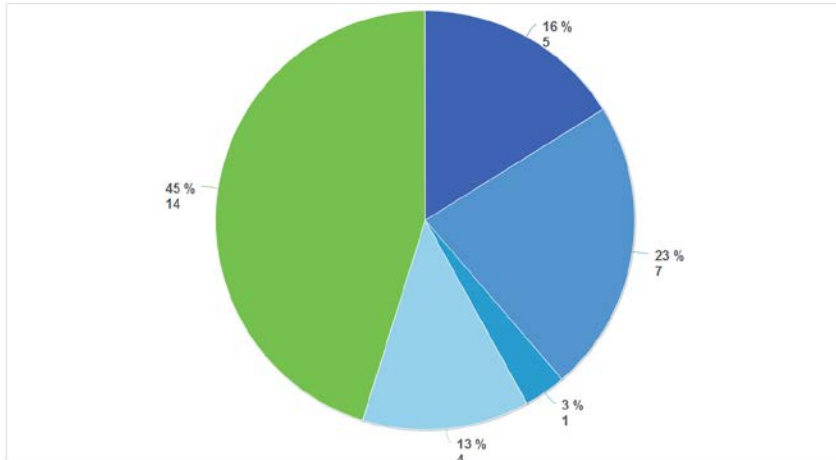
Nearly half (45%) of graduates with a BA degree in Language Studies reported being employed within 6 months of graduation.



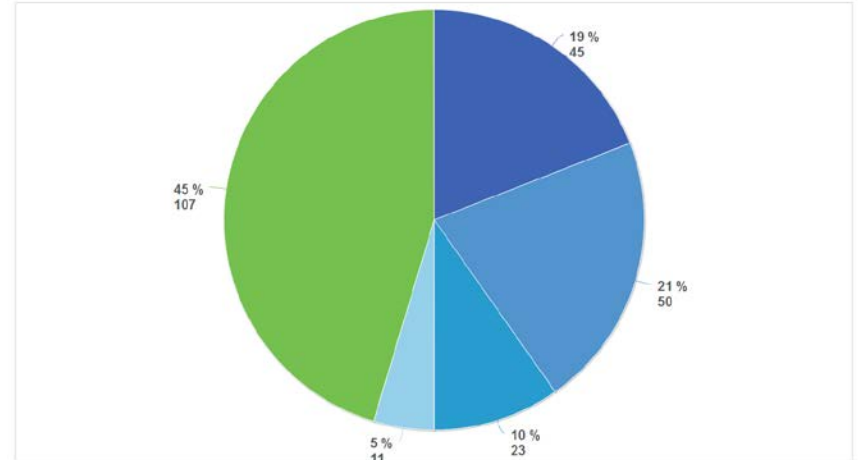

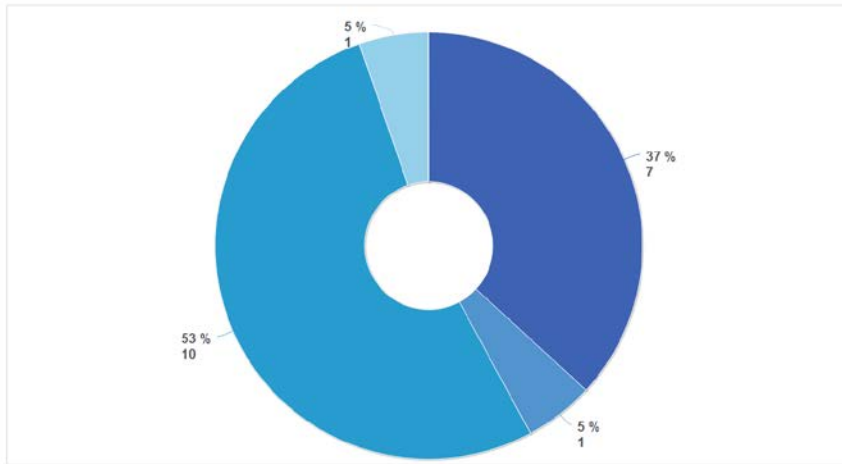

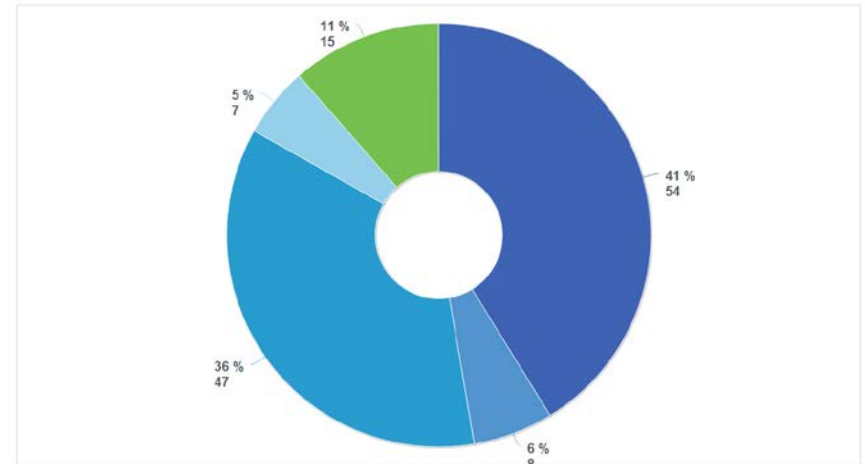


Six months after graduation, more Language Studies BA graduates were employed than were seeking employment.

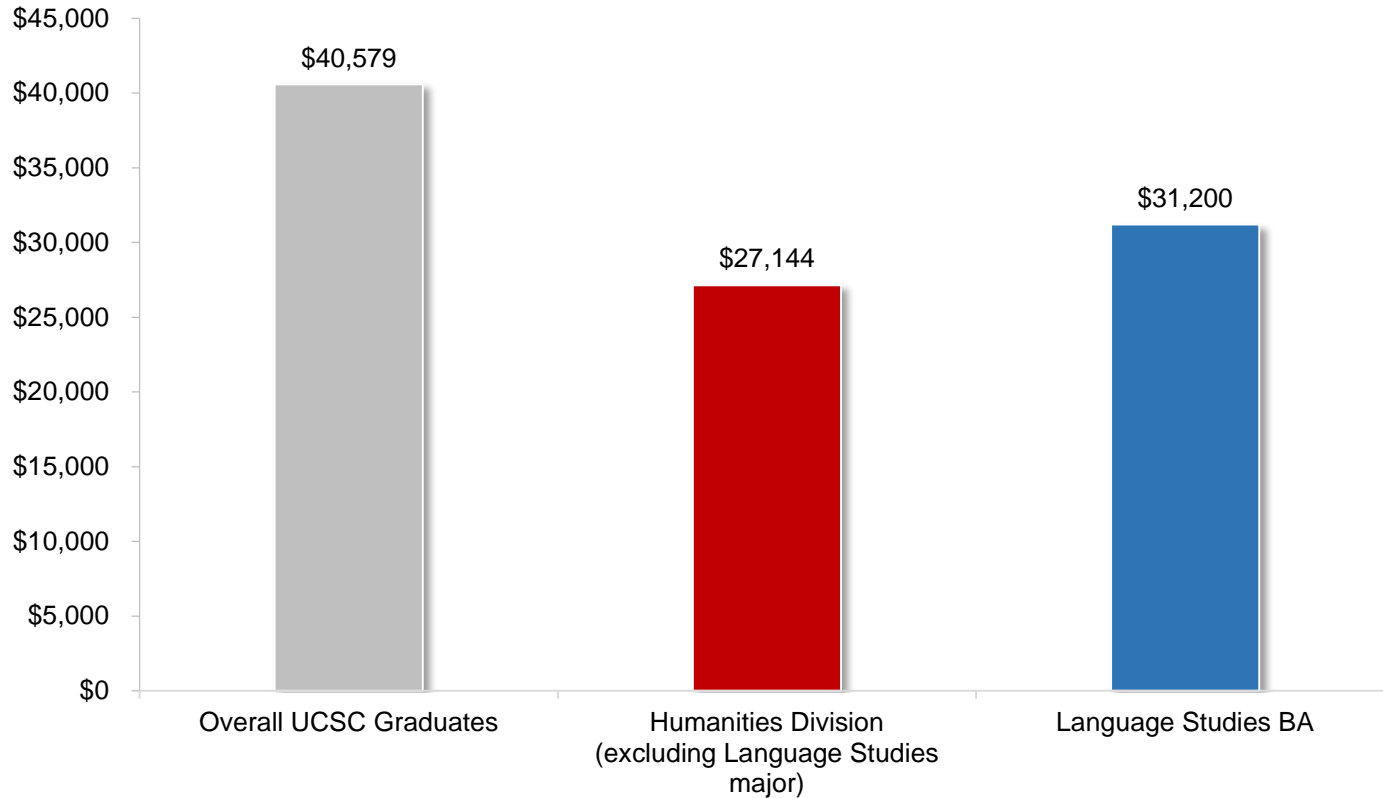

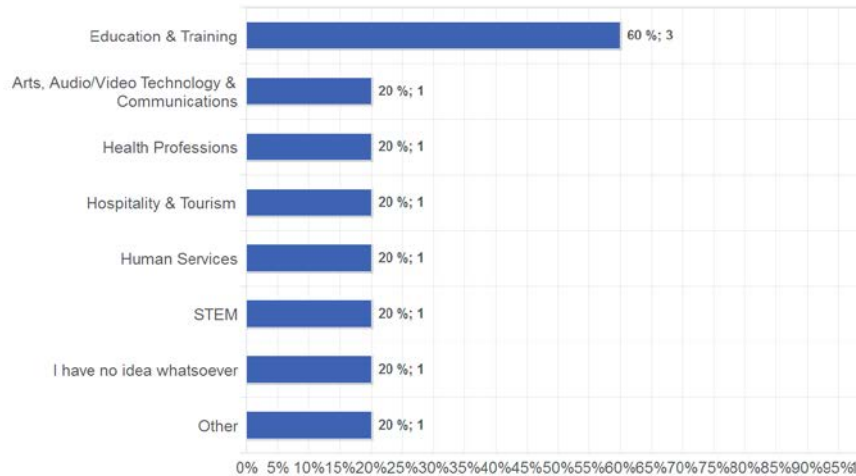

UCSC Language Studies BA Graduates Median Annual Salary

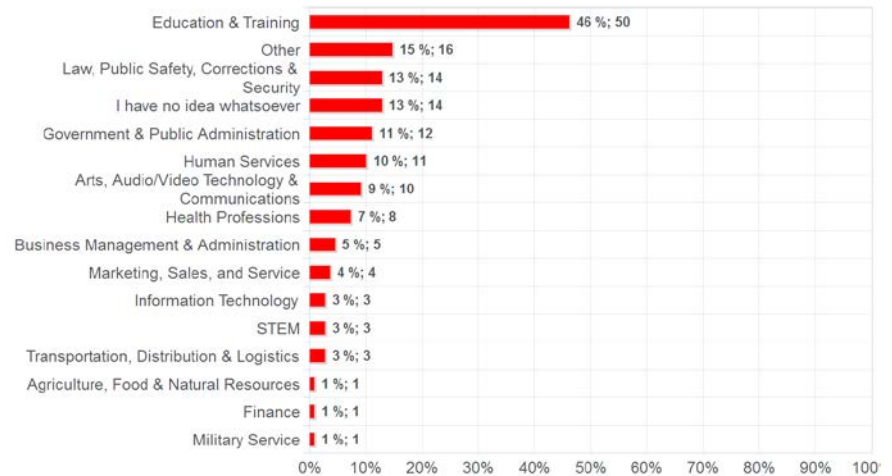


Half of graduates with a BA degree in Language Studies reported earning \$31,200 annually or higher within 6 months of graduation.

UCSC Language Studies BA Graduates Future Career Plans



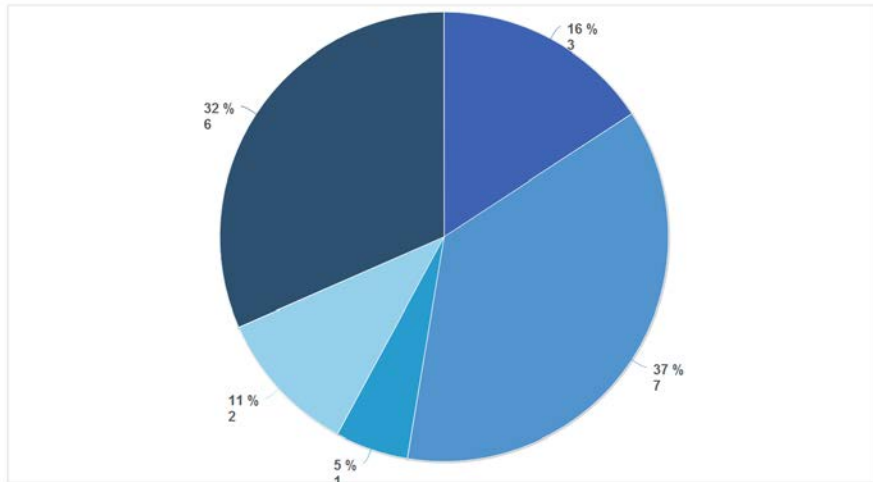

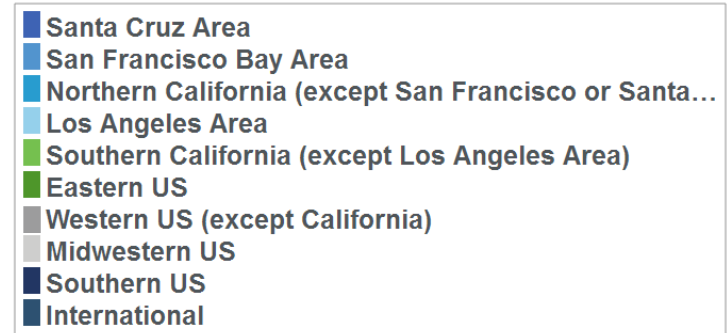

More than half (60%) of Language Studies BA graduates hoped to have a career in Education & Training after completing their higher education.

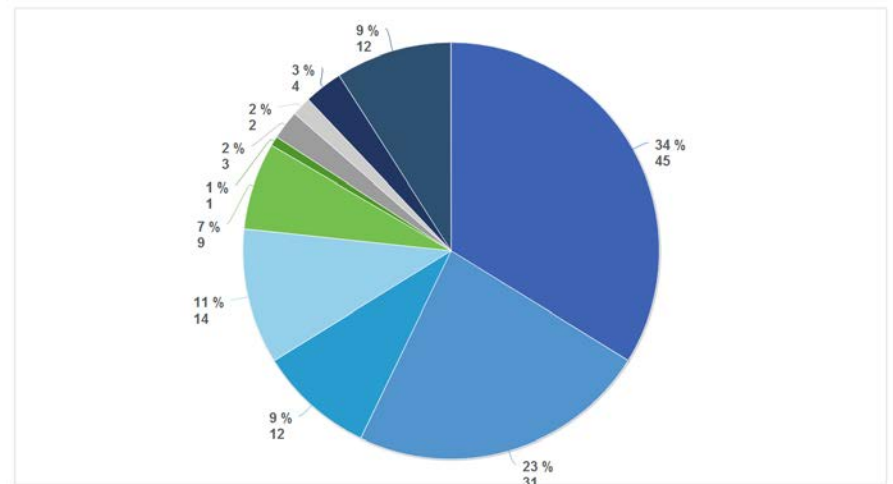
UCSC Language Studies BA Graduates Geographic destinations of those with jobs

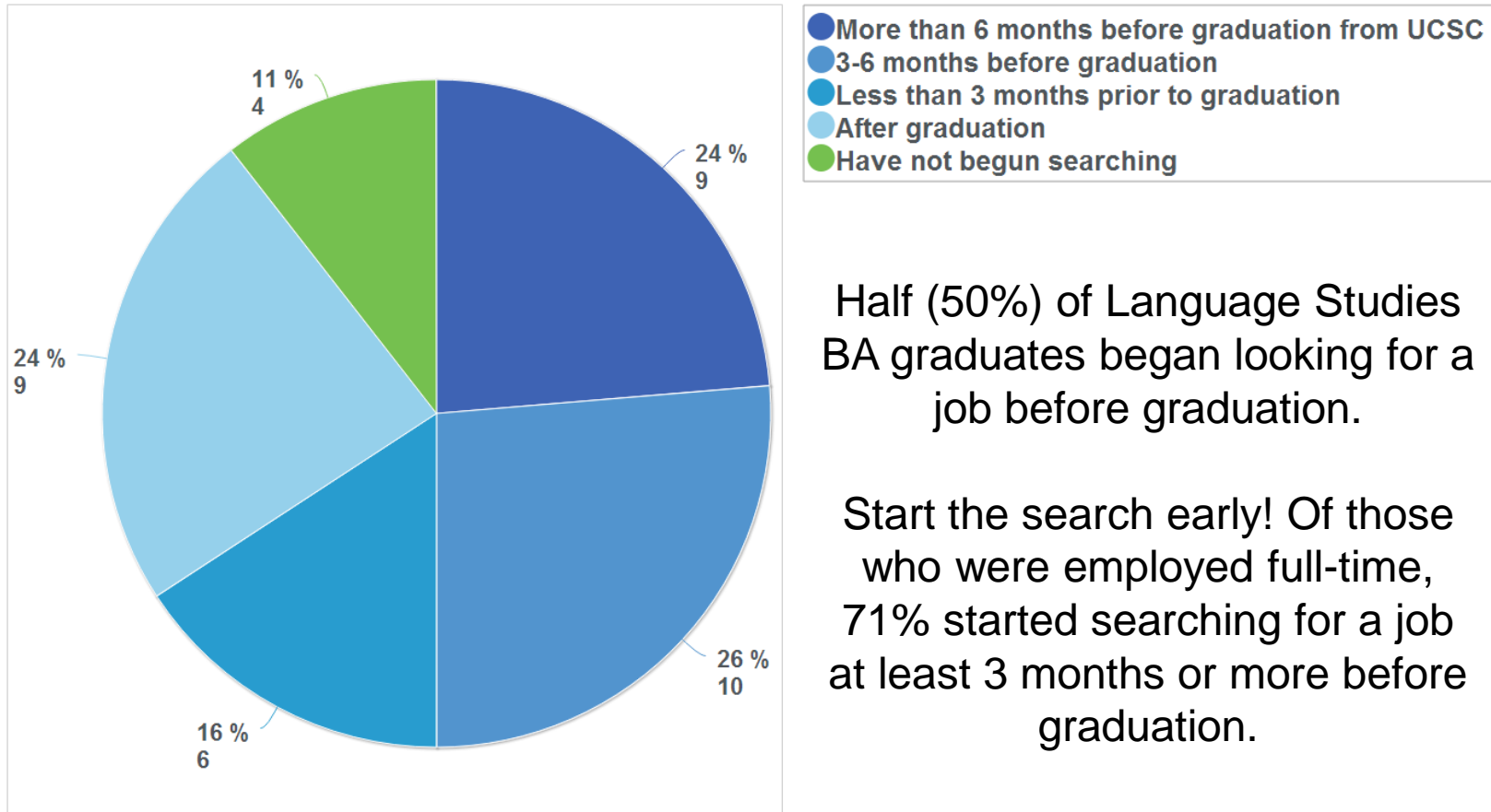
More than half (53%) of Language Studies BA graduates plan to work in the Santa Cruz or San Francisco Bay Area.

When did they start looking for a job?

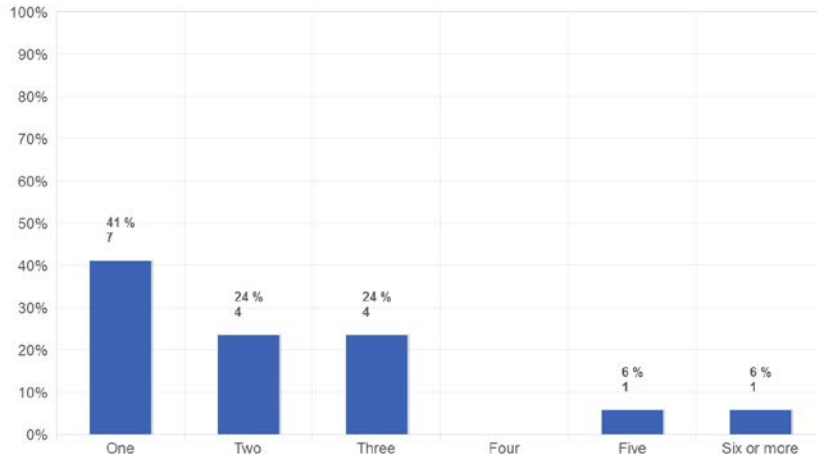


Half (50%) of Language Studies BA graduates began looking for a job before graduation.

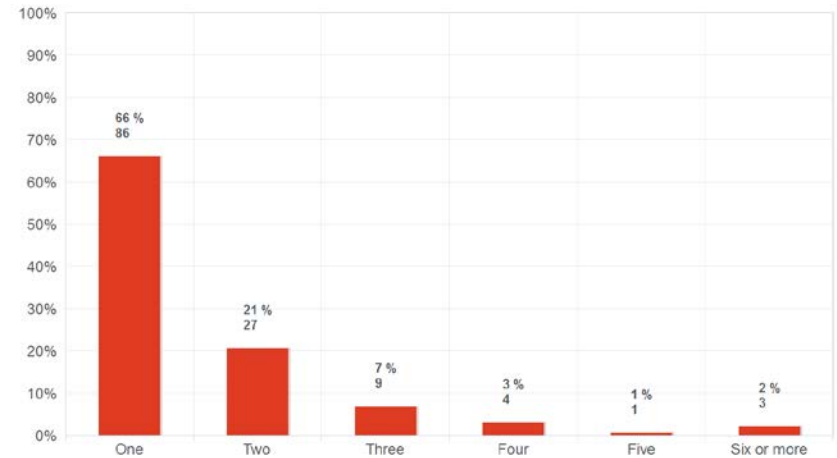
Start the search early! Of those who were employed full-time, 71% started searching for a job at least 3 months or more before graduation.

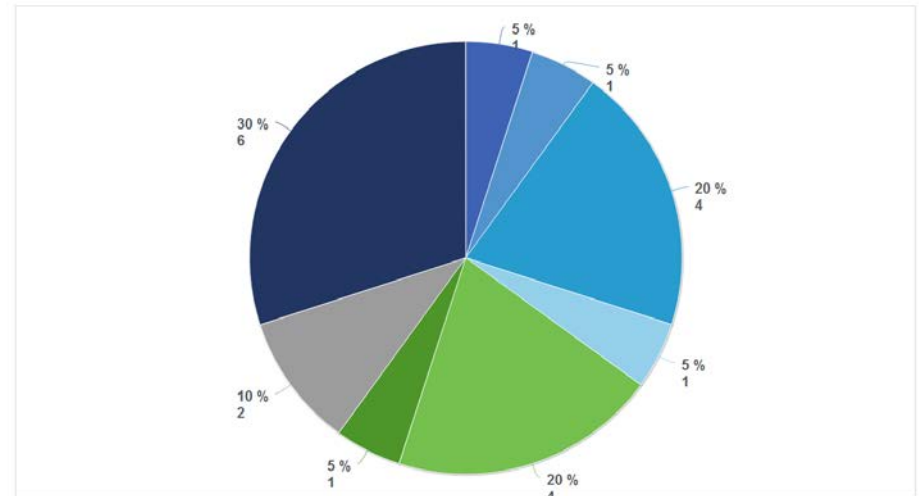
