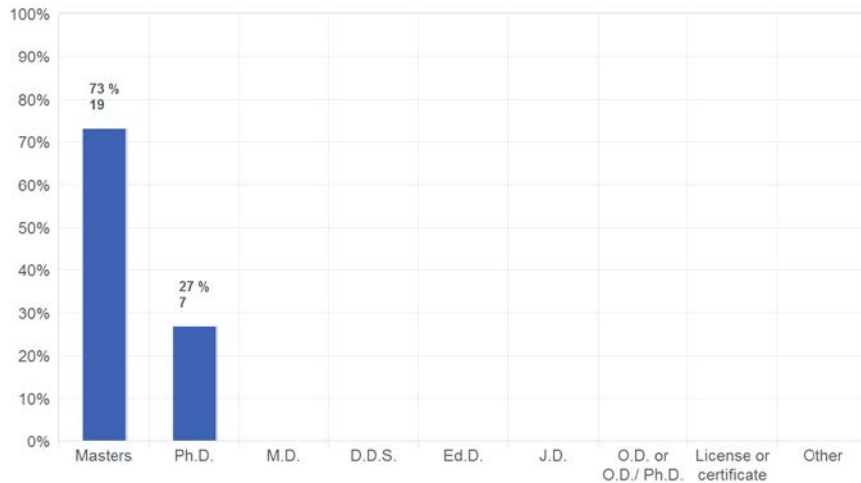

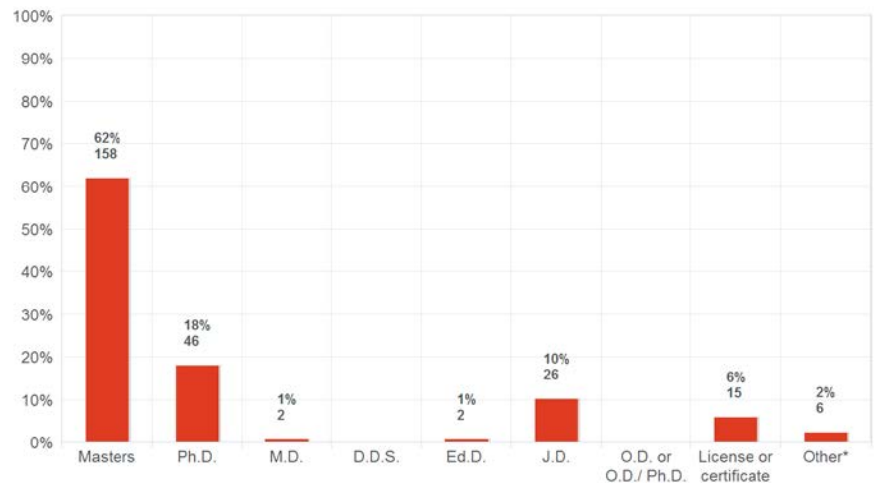
About two-thirds (62%) of Linguistics BA degrees had plans to pursue graduate education.

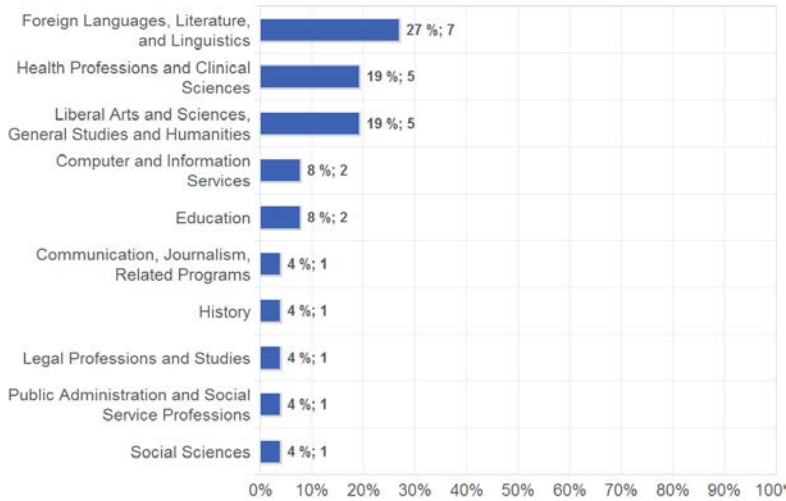

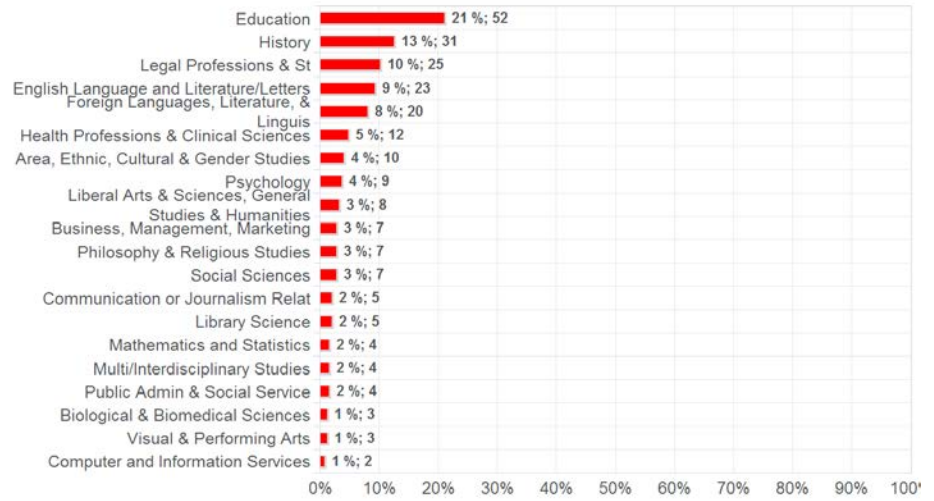
All graduates with a Linguistics Major reported plans to obtain an advanced degree – either a Masters or PhD.

Most Popular Field of Future Academic Study



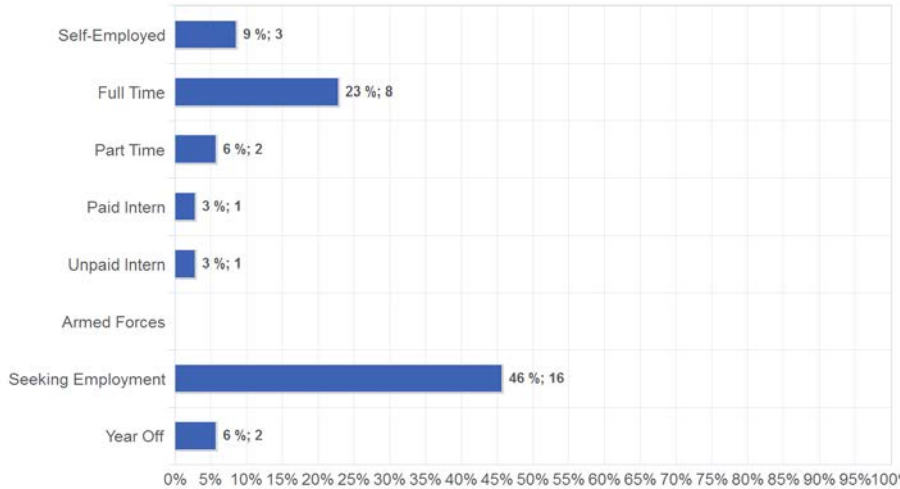

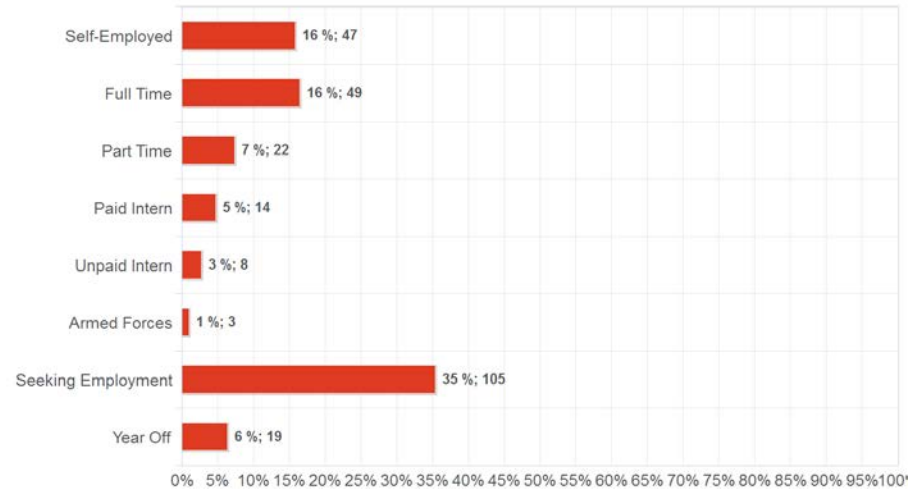

UCSC Linguistics BA Graduates Employment Plans



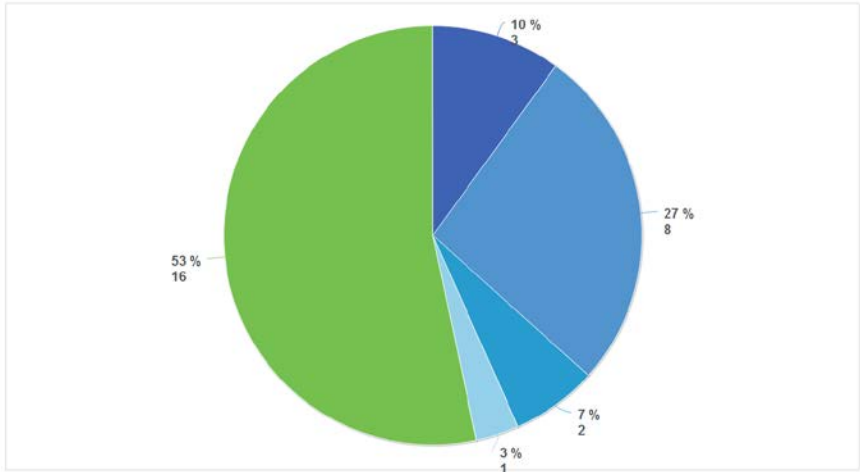
Linguistics Major

Slightly less than half (41%) of graduates with a BA degree in Linguistics reported being employed within 6 months of graduation.

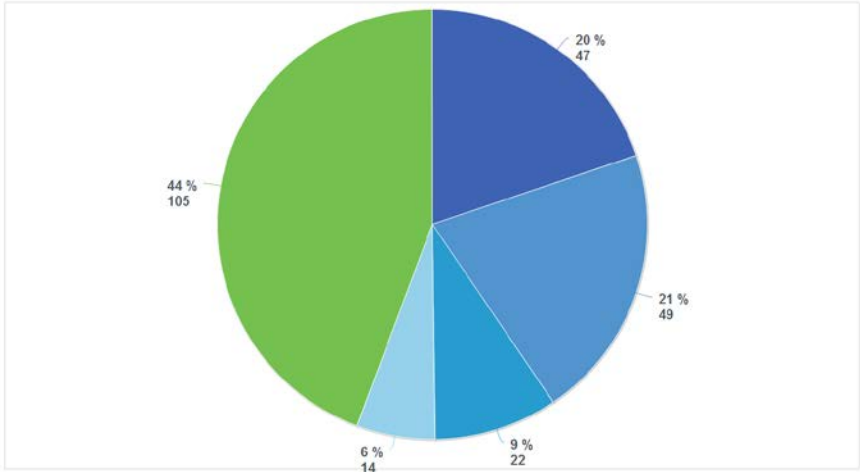

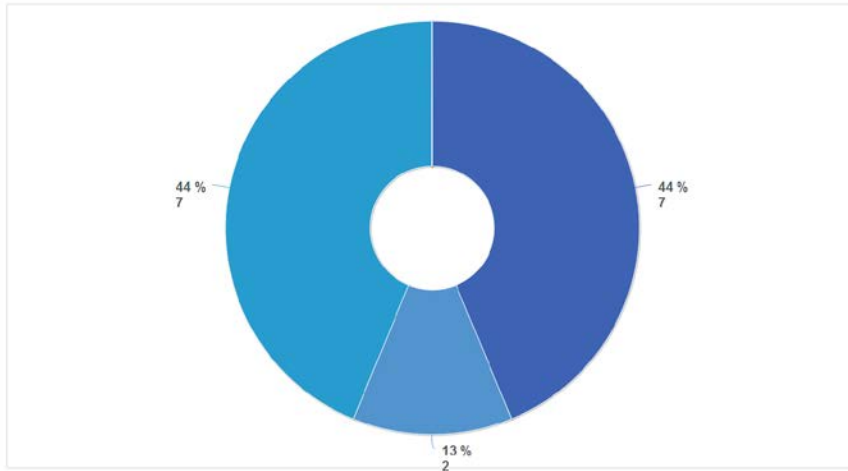

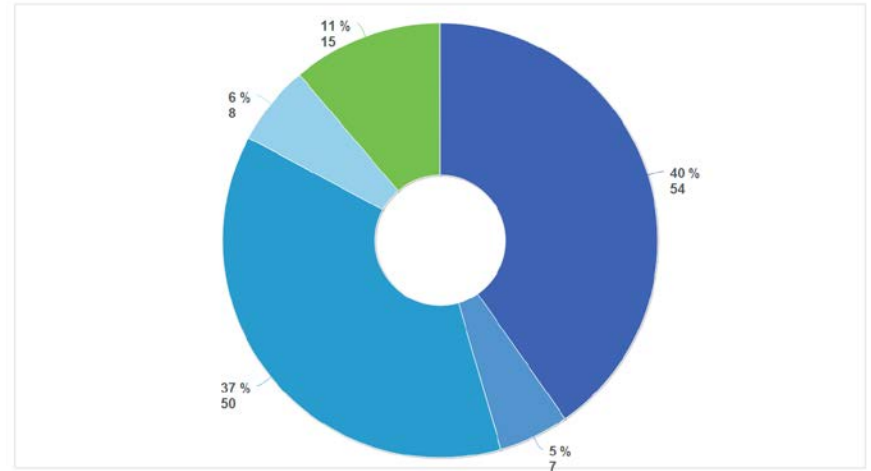
Six months after graduation, the number of Linguistics BA graduates who were employed was similar to the number seeking employment.

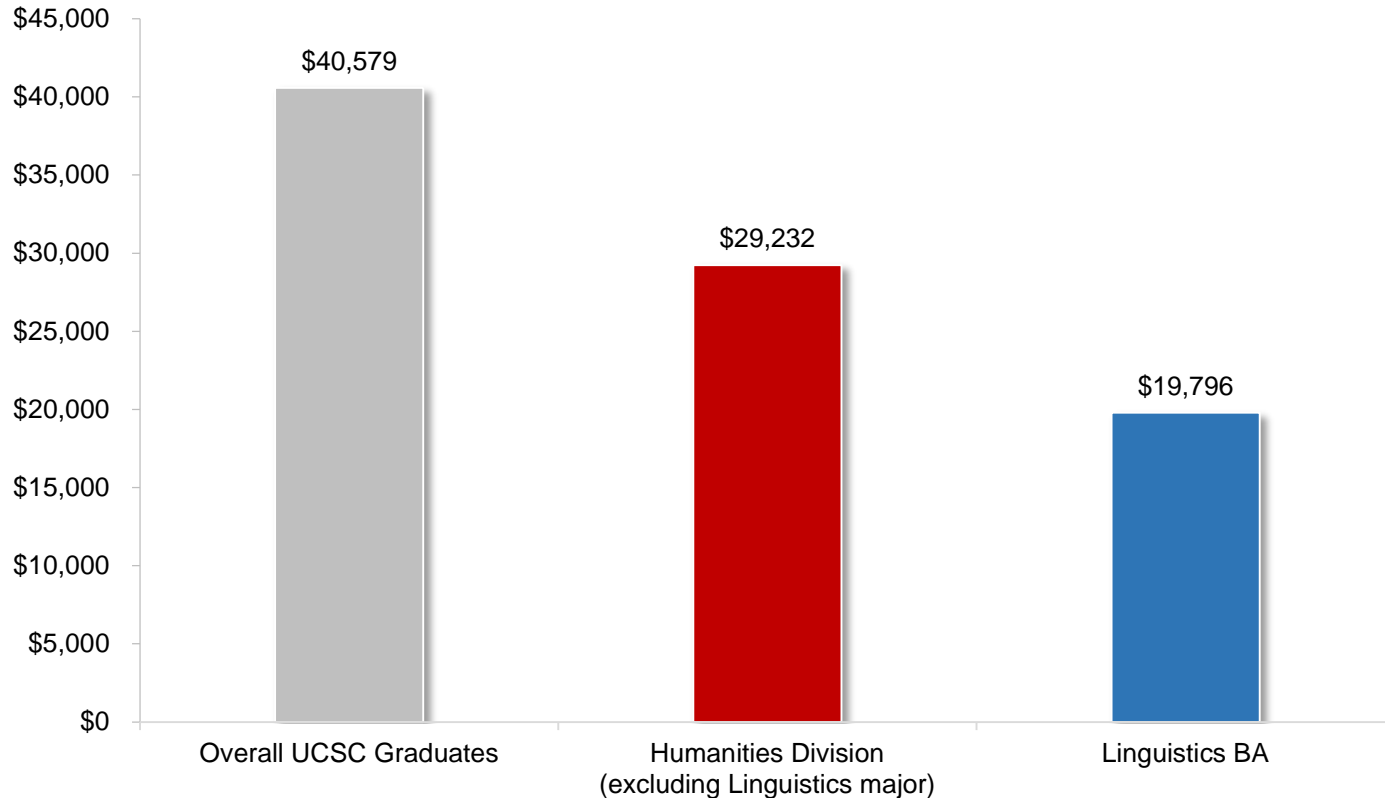


Of those employed, the vast majority (88%) of BA Linguistics graduates reported working in the Business or Education sector within 6 months of graduation.

UCSC Linguistics BA Graduates Employers & Job Titles

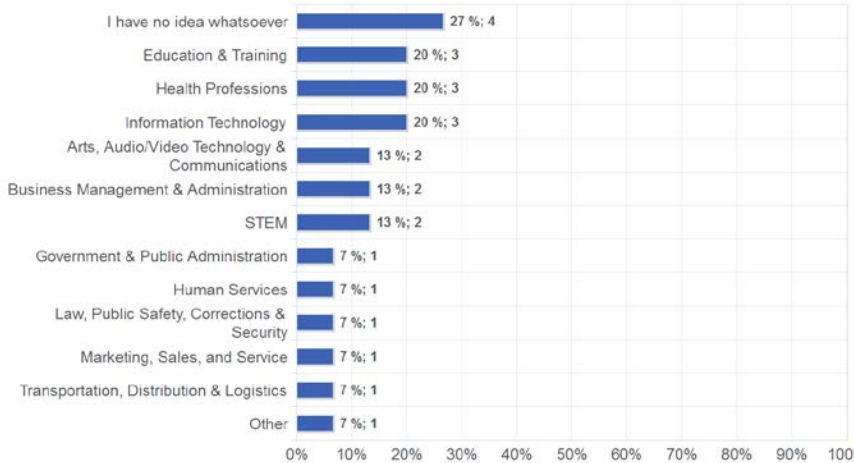


UCSC Linguistics BA Graduates Median Annual Salary

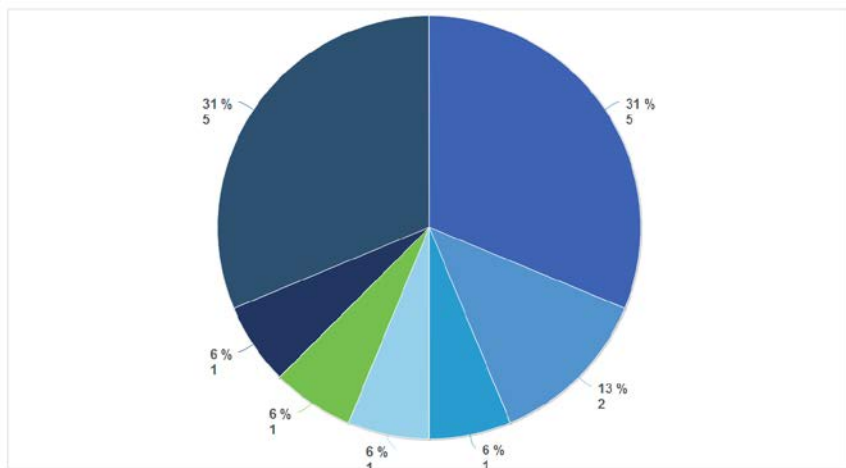

Linguistics BA graduates hoped to pursue careers in a variety of fields after completing their education, the most popular of which were Education & Training, Health Professions, and Information Technology.

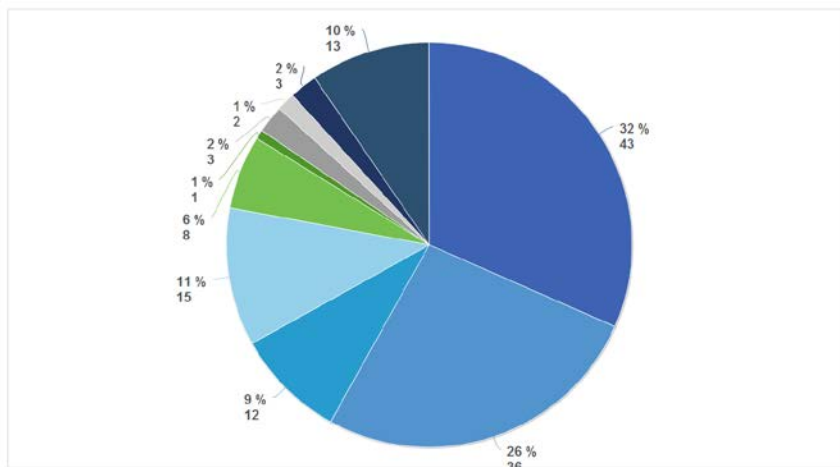
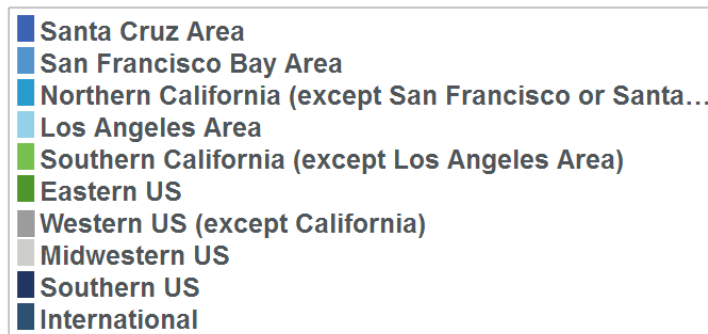

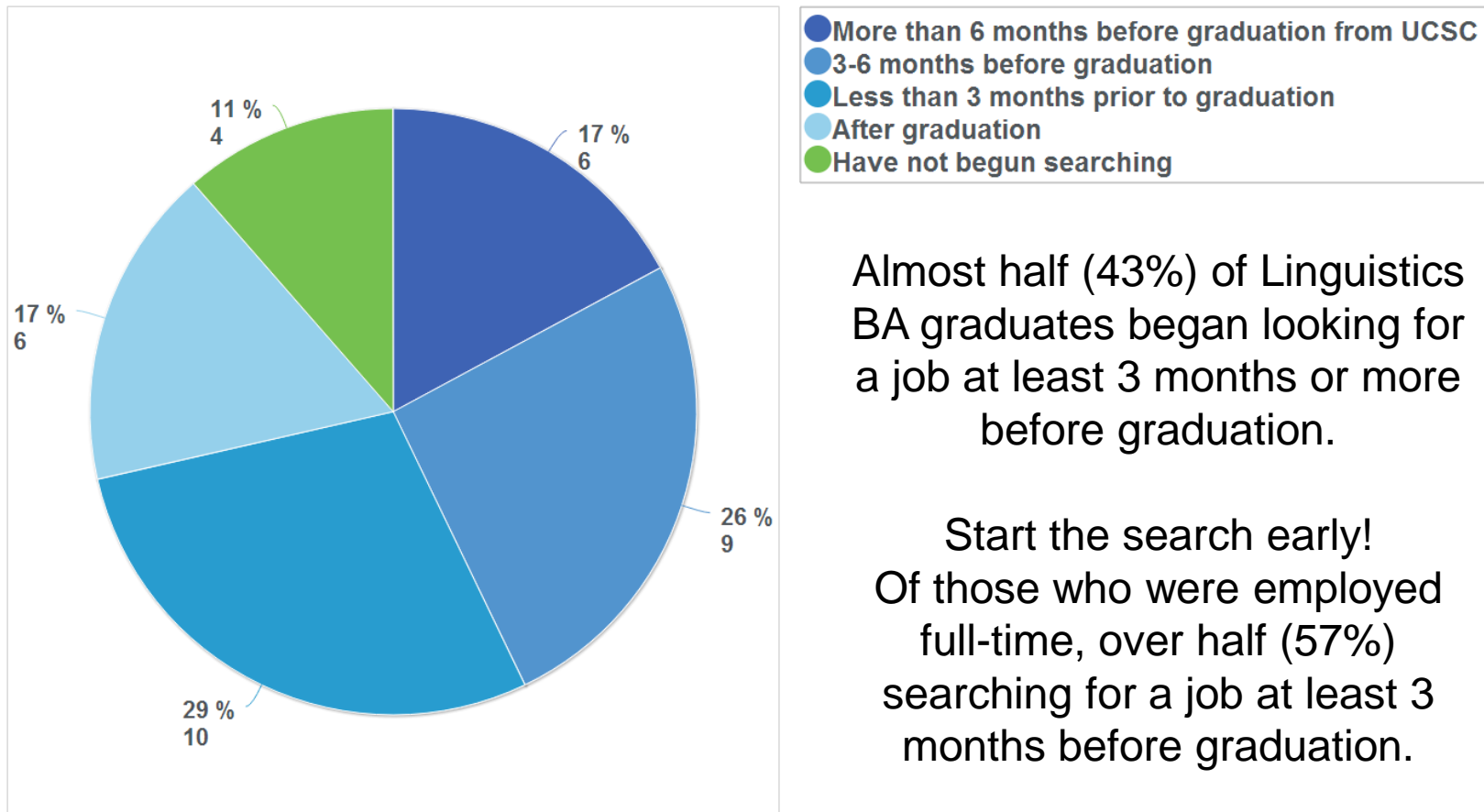
About one-third (31%) of Linguistics BA graduates plan to work in the Santa Cruz area, and about one-third (31%) plan to work somewhere outside the United States.

When did they start looking for a job? (employed & seeking employment)

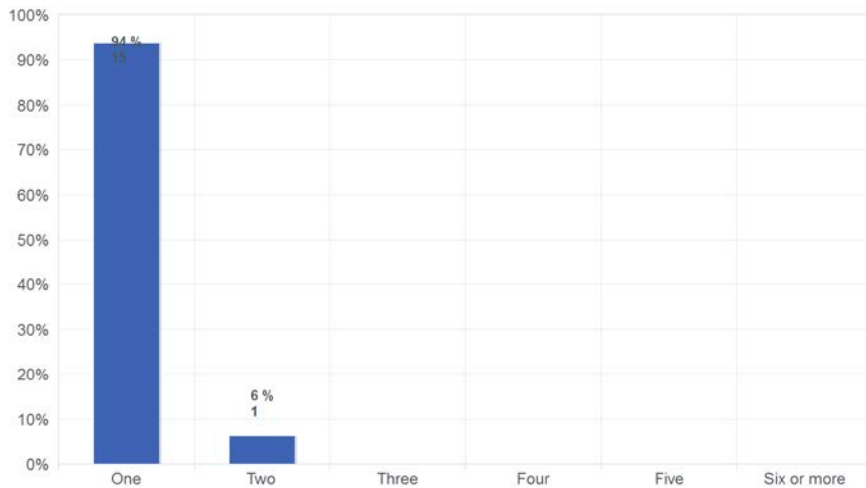


Almost half (43%) of Linguistics BA graduates began looking for a job at least 3 months or more before graduation.

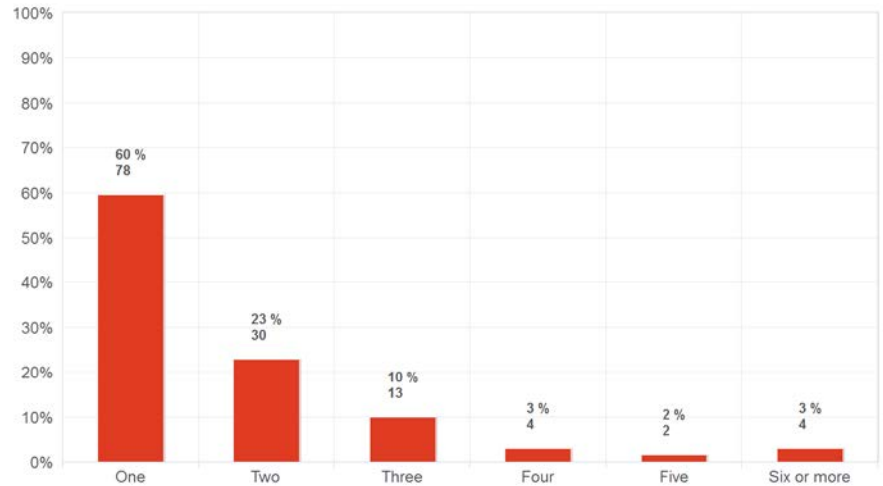
Start the search early!

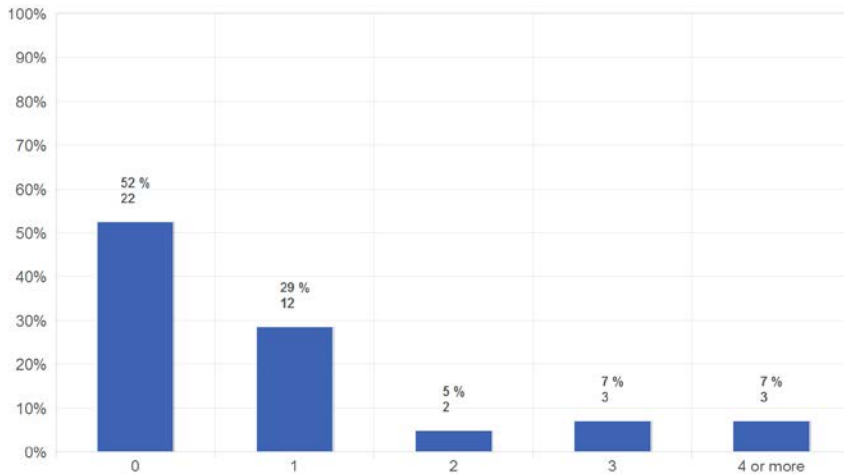
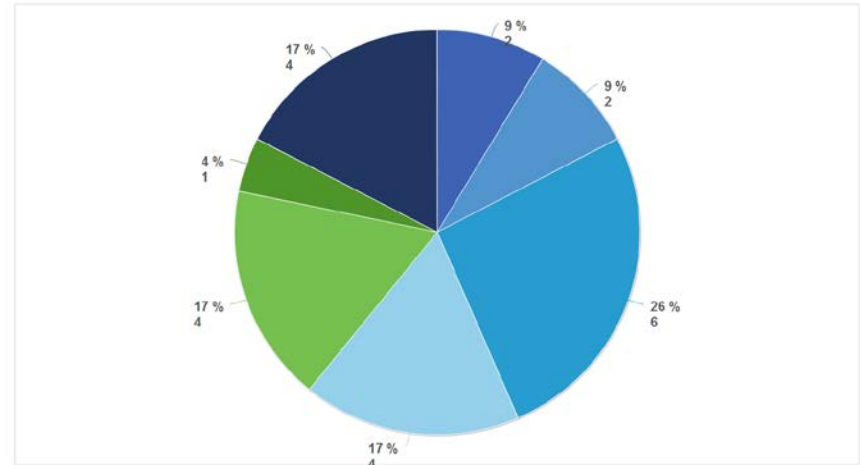


Humanities Division (excluding Linguistics Major)

UCSC Linguistics BA Graduates Internships

More graduates reported that they found their internship by networking with UCSC contacts (26%) and personal contacts (17%) than by other means.
