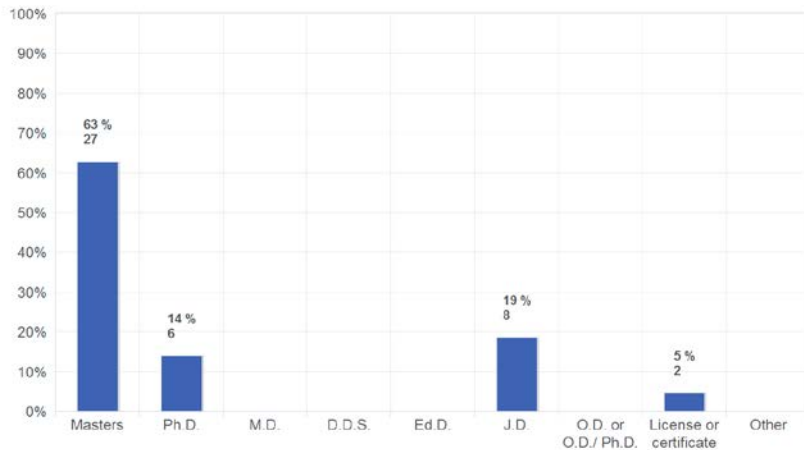

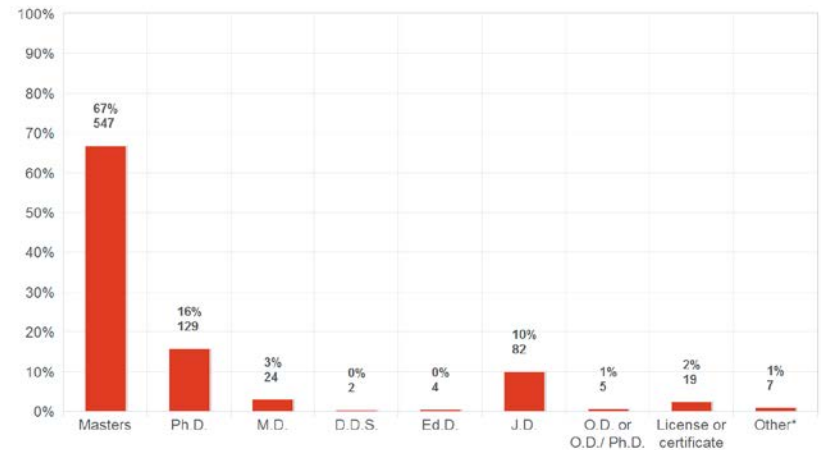
The majority (85%) of Latin American & Latino Studies BA degree graduates had plans to pursue graduate education.

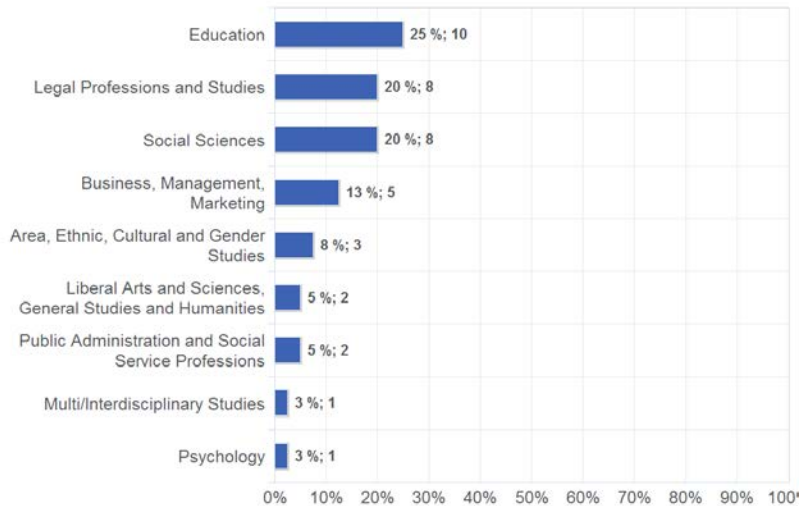

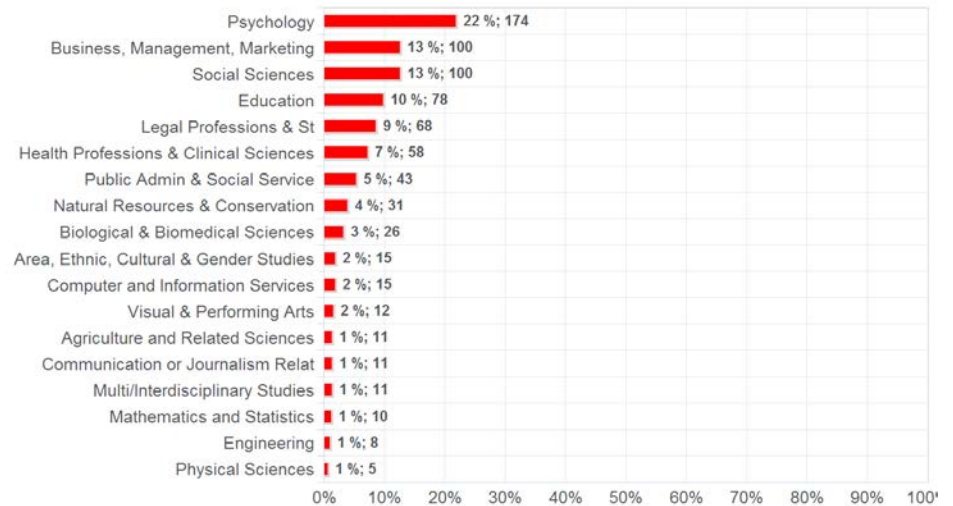
The majority (77%) of graduates with a Latin American & Latino Studies Major plan to obtain either a Masters degree or PhD.

Most Popular Field of Future Academic Study



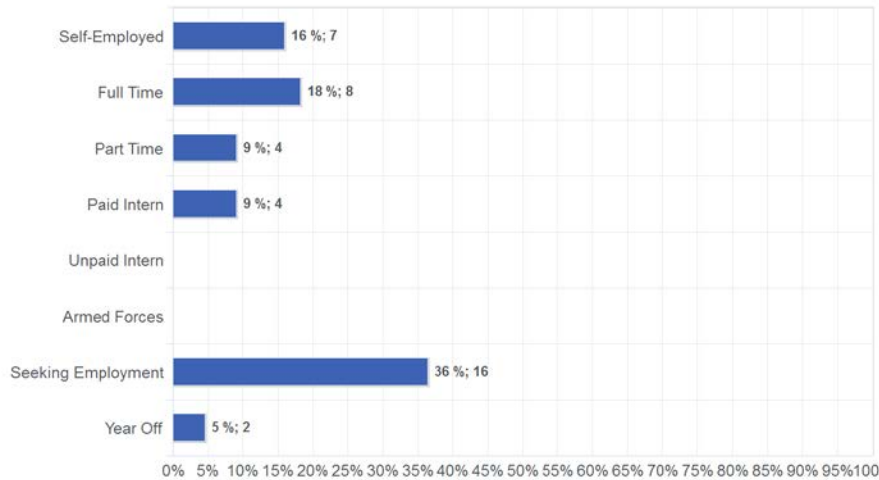

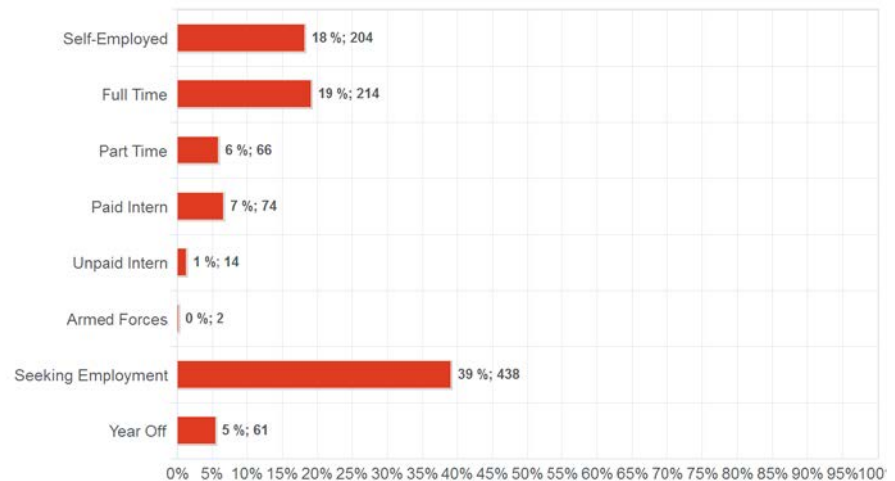

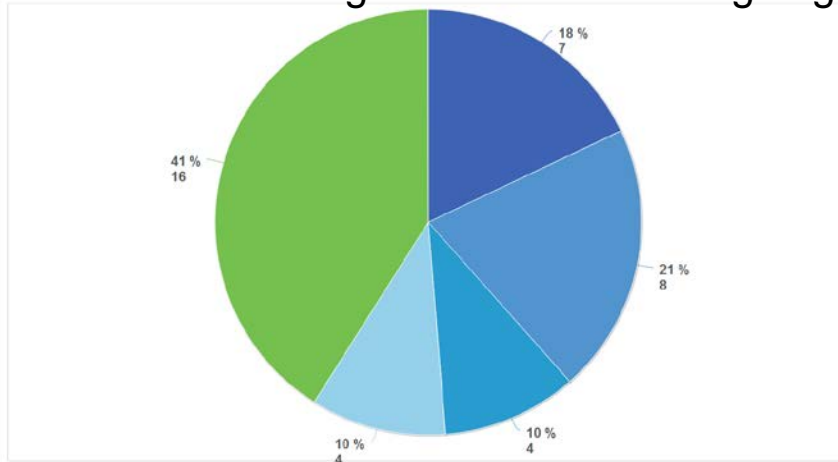
Over half (51%) of graduates with a BA degree in Latin American & Latino Studies reported being employed within 6 months of graduation.



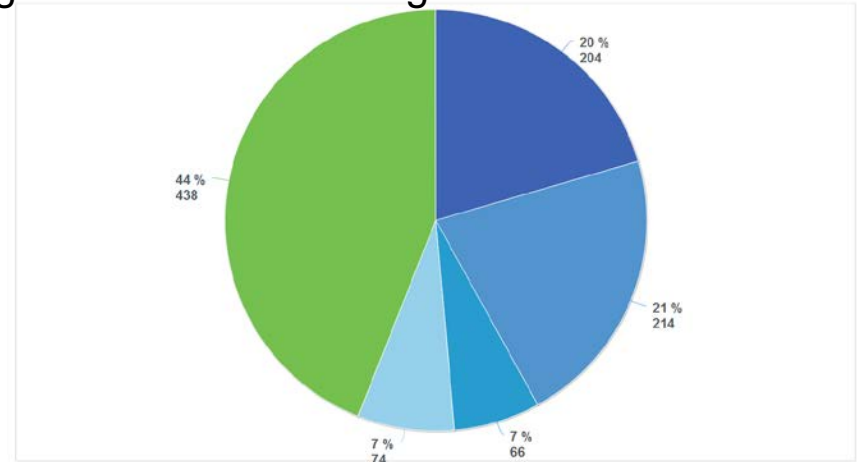

UCSC Latin American & Latino Studies BA Graduates Employed vs Seeking Employment

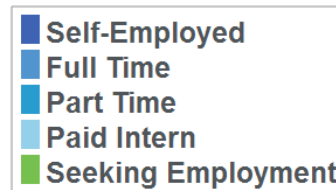
Among those who are not going to graduate school after graduation....

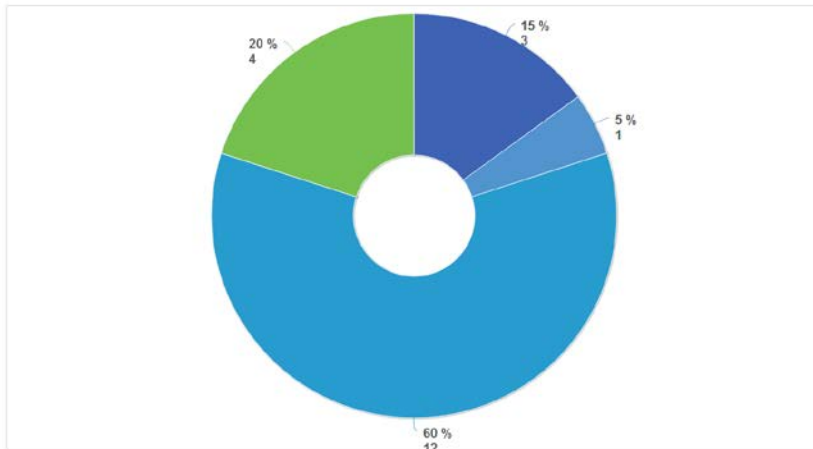

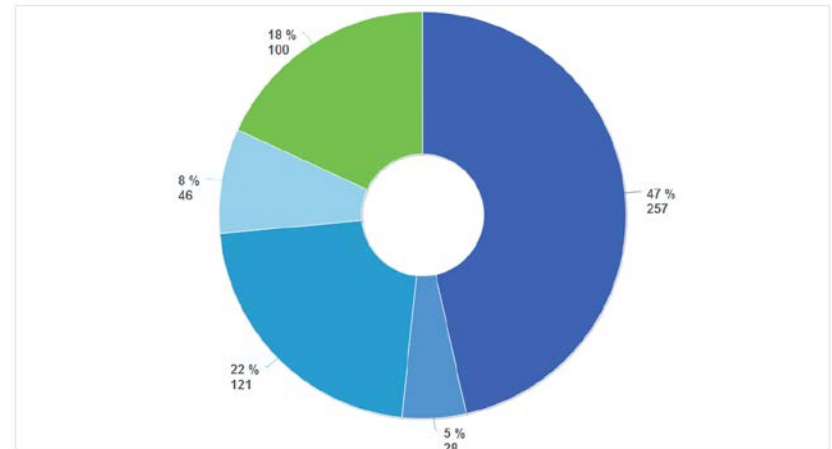
More graduates with a BA degree in Latin American & Latino Studies were employed than seeking employment 6 months after graduation.

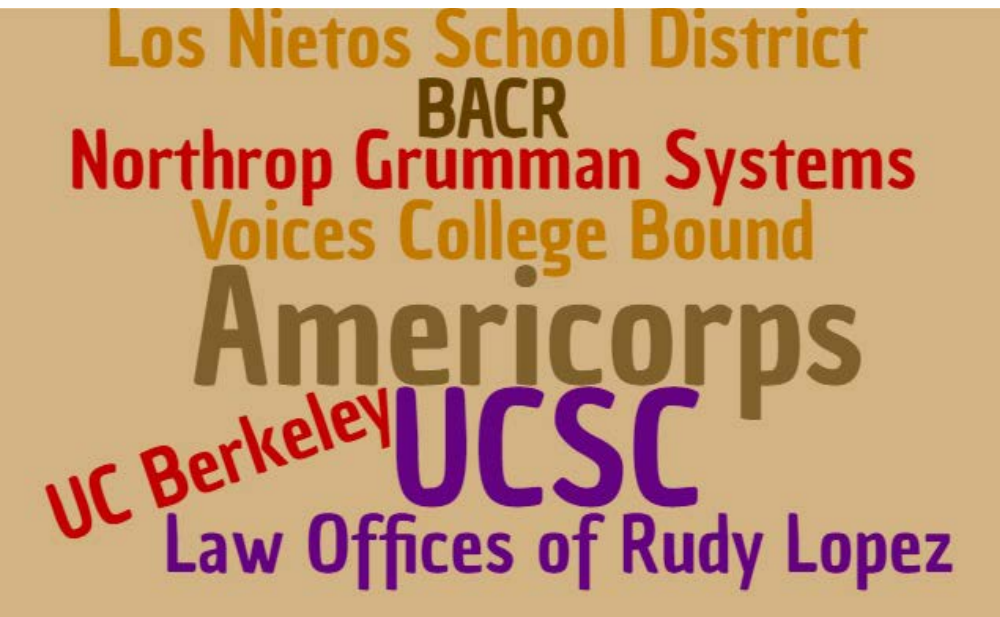

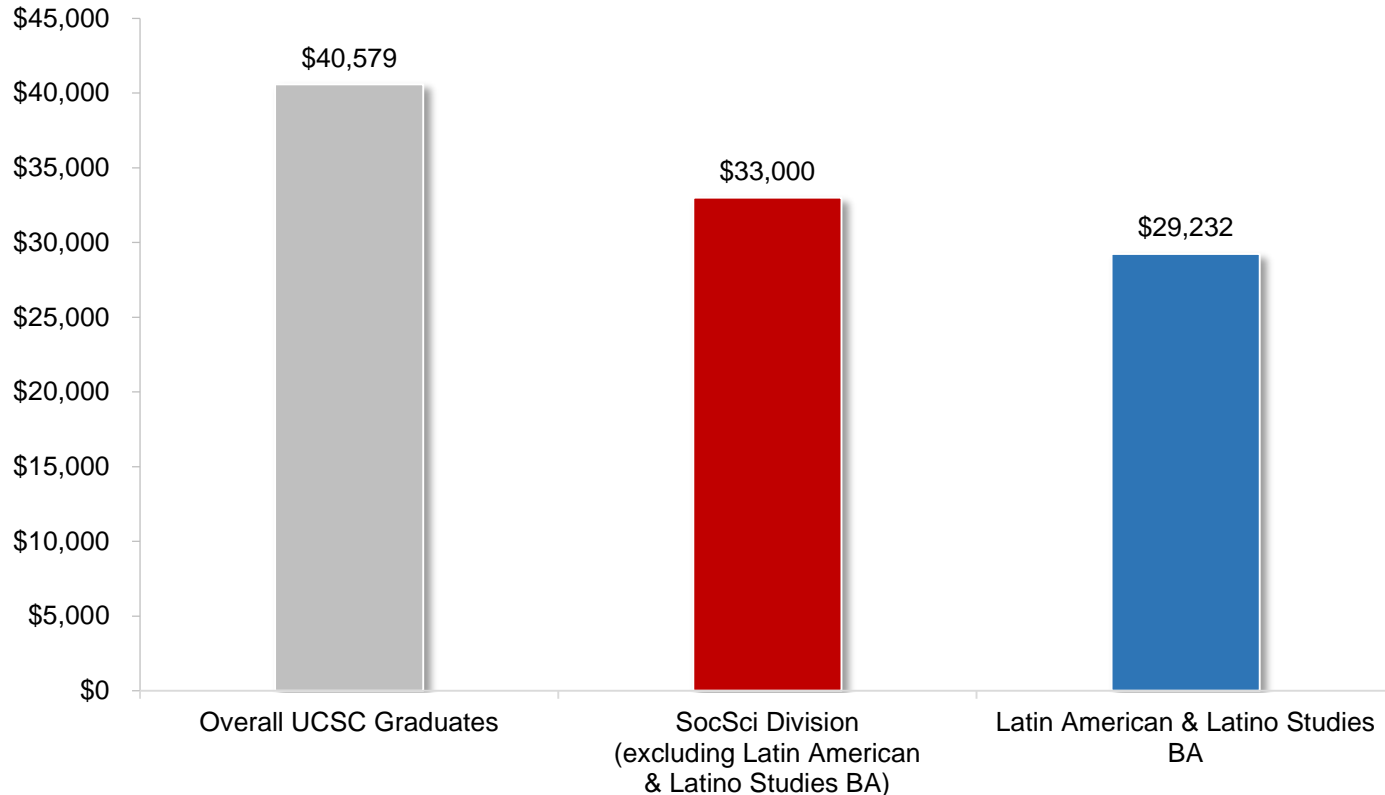


Of those employed, 60% of Latin American & Latino Studies BA graduates reported working in the Education sector within 6 months of graduation.

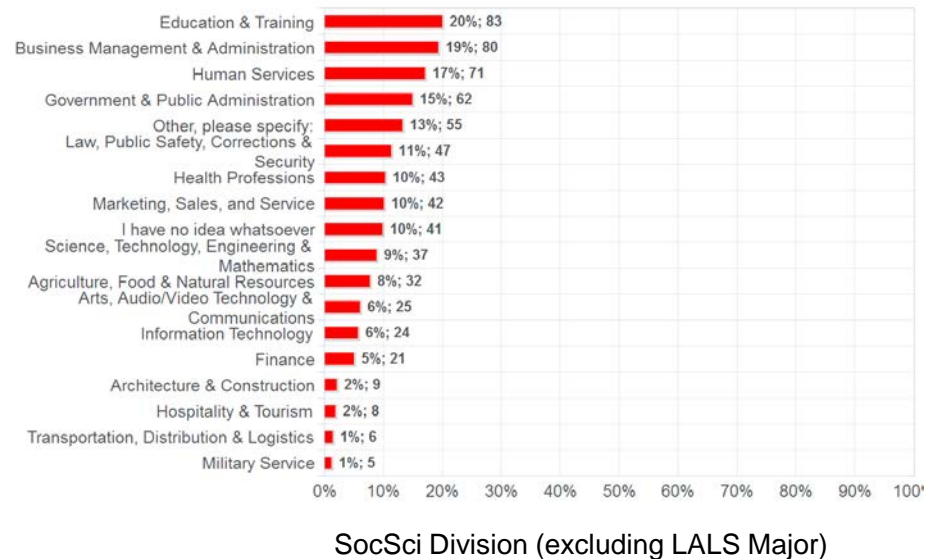
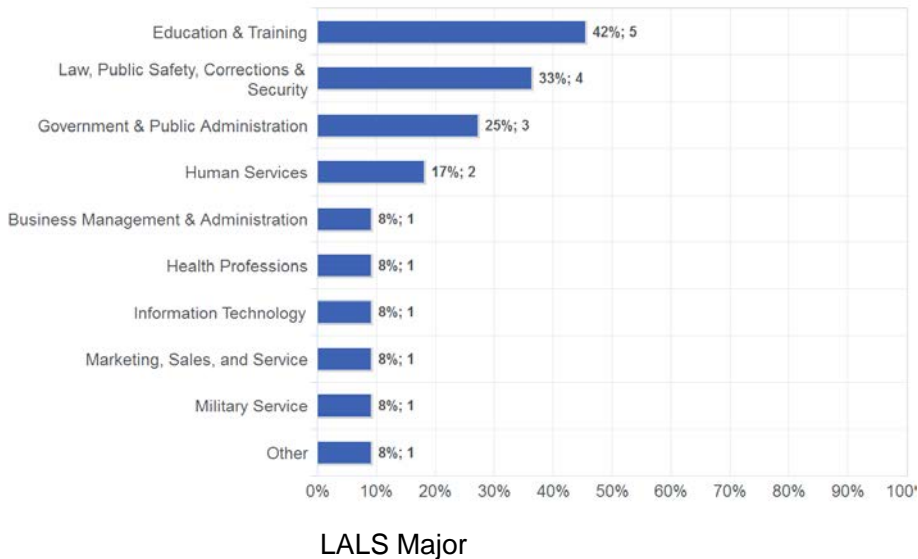
UCSC Latin American & Latino Studies BA Graduates Median Annual Salary

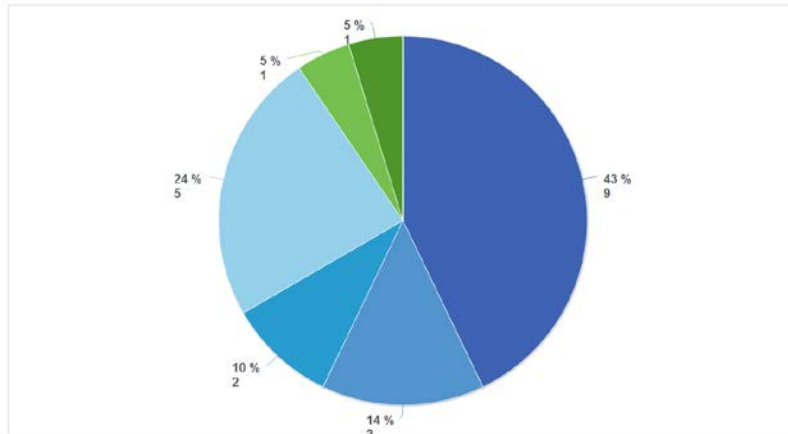
Future Career Plans



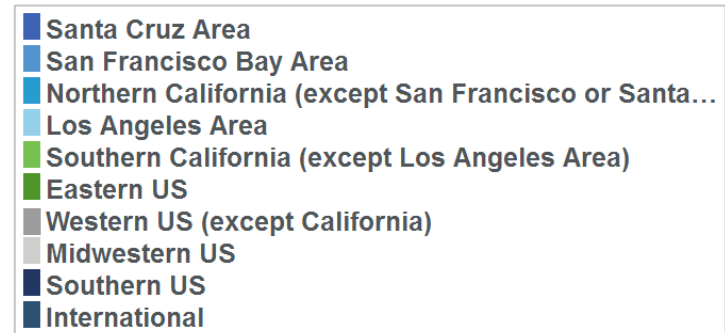
42% of Latin American & Latino Studies BA graduates hoped to have a career in Education & Training after completing their education.

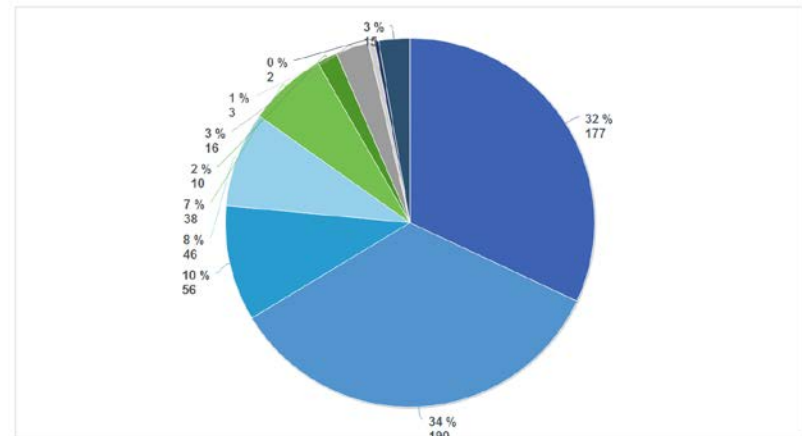
Geographic destinations of those with a job

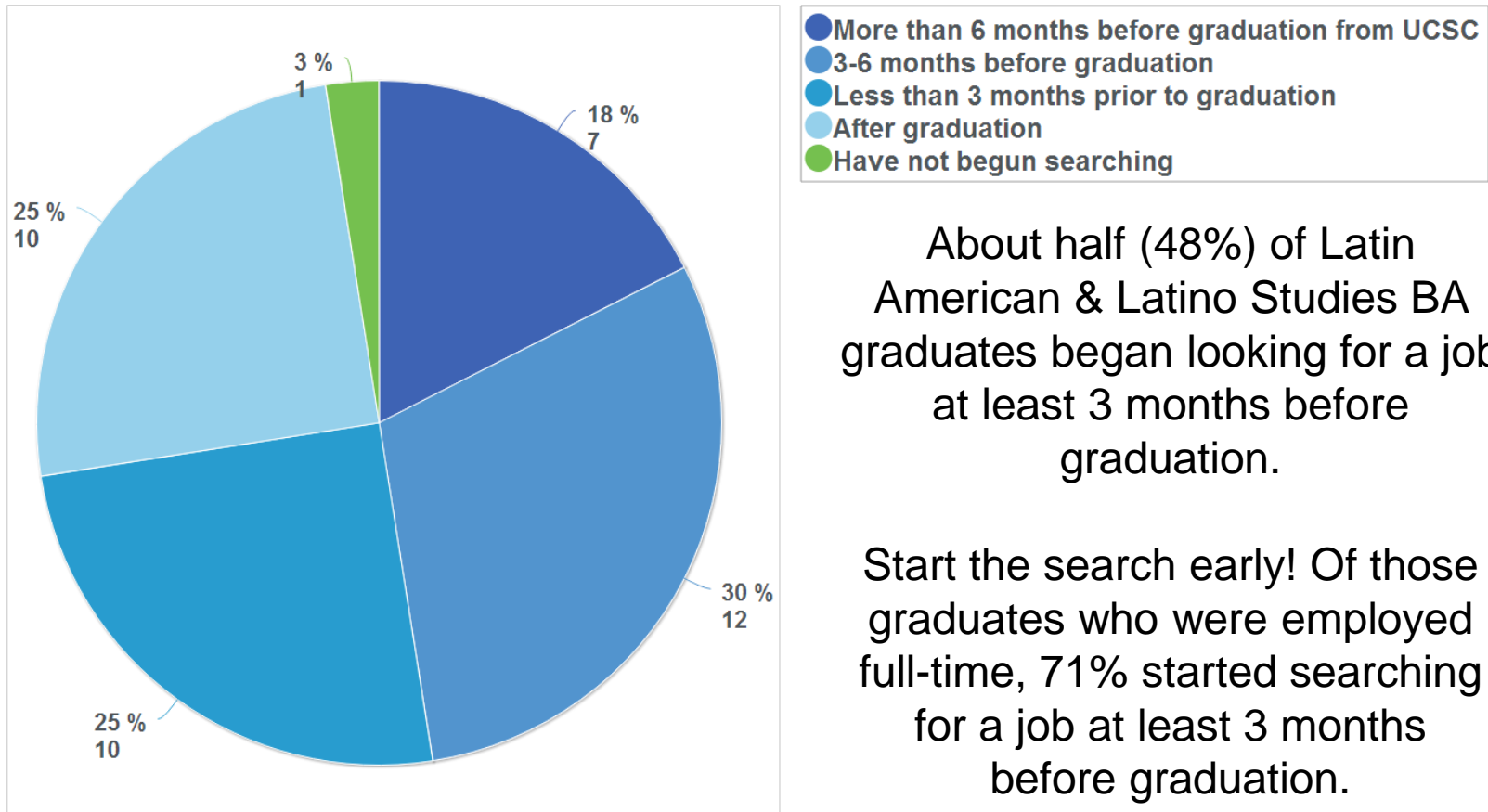
More than half (57%) of Latin American & Latino Studies BA graduates reported that they plan to work locally in the Santa Cruz or San Francisco Bay Area.

When did they start looking for a job? (employed & seeking employment)

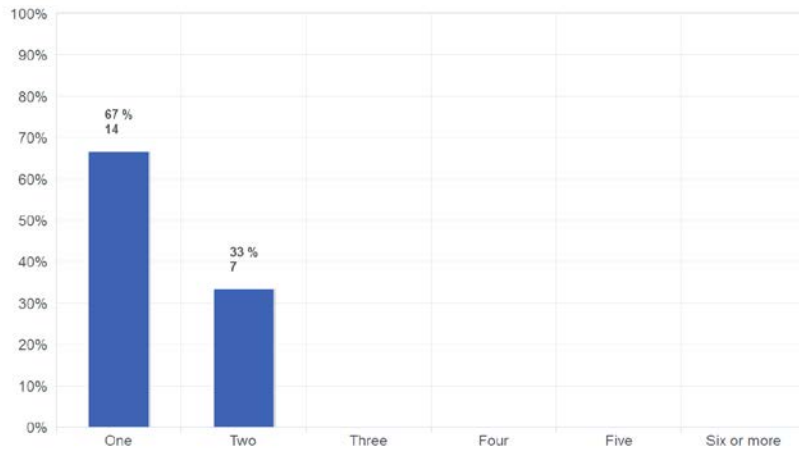


About half (48%) of Latin American & Latino Studies BA graduates began looking for a job at least 3 months before graduation.

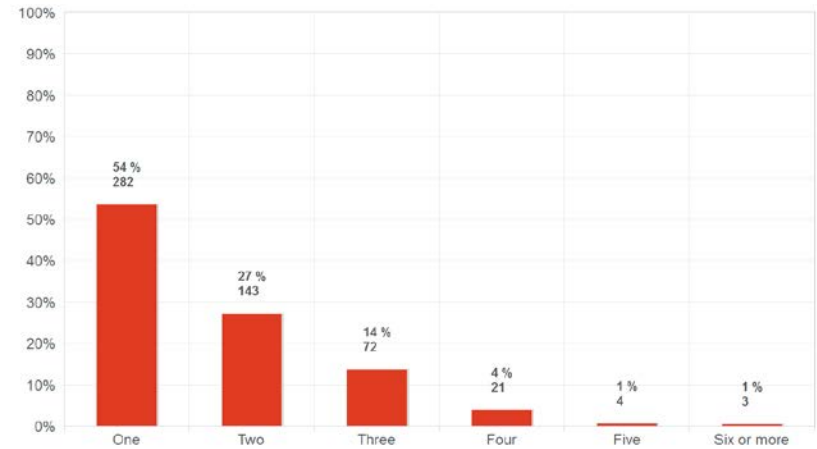
Start the search early! Of those graduates who were employed full-time, 71% started searching for a job at least 3 months before graduation.

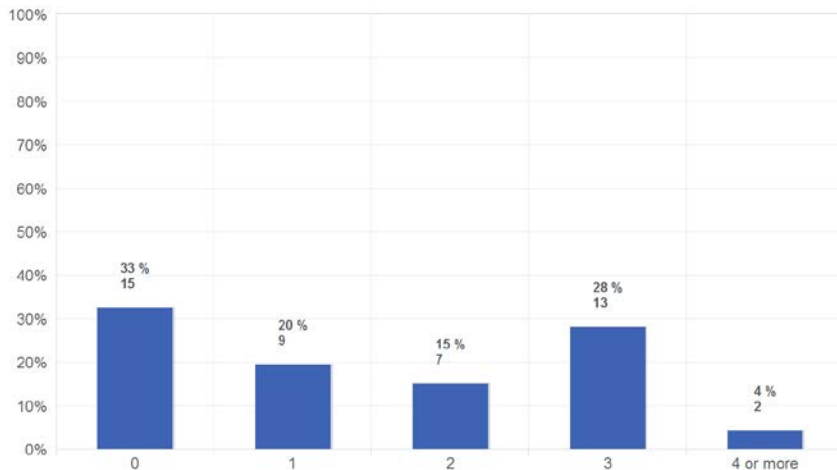
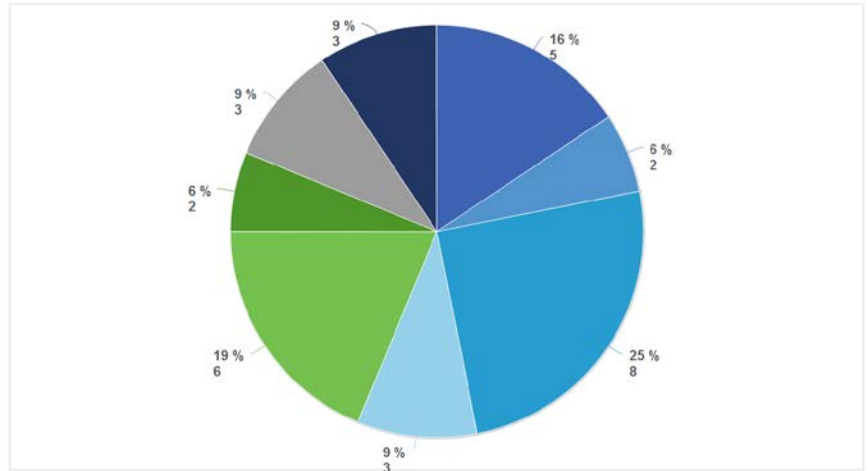

Of those employed, one-third (33%) of graduates with a BA degree in Latin American & Latino Studies received more than one job offer.

UCSC Latin American & Latino Studies BA Graduates Internships

56% of graduates reported that they found their internship via UCSC resources – through SlugQuest, on-campus interviews, UCSC Career Center Fair, or networking with UCSC contacts.
