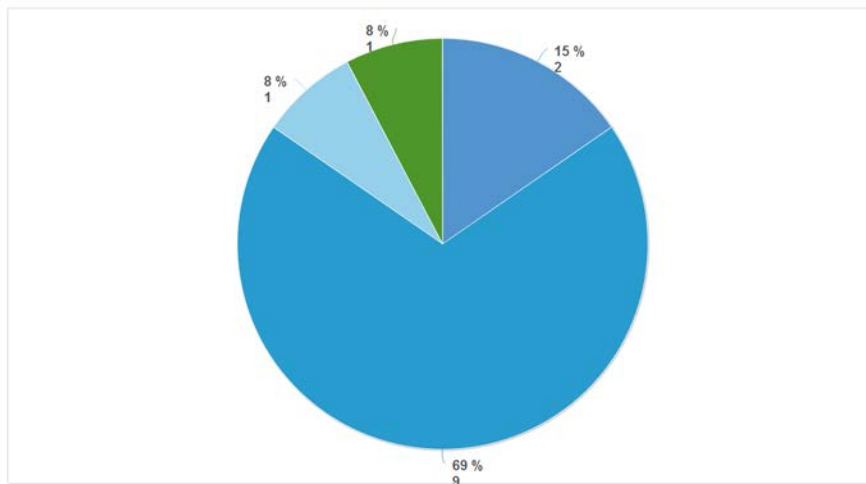
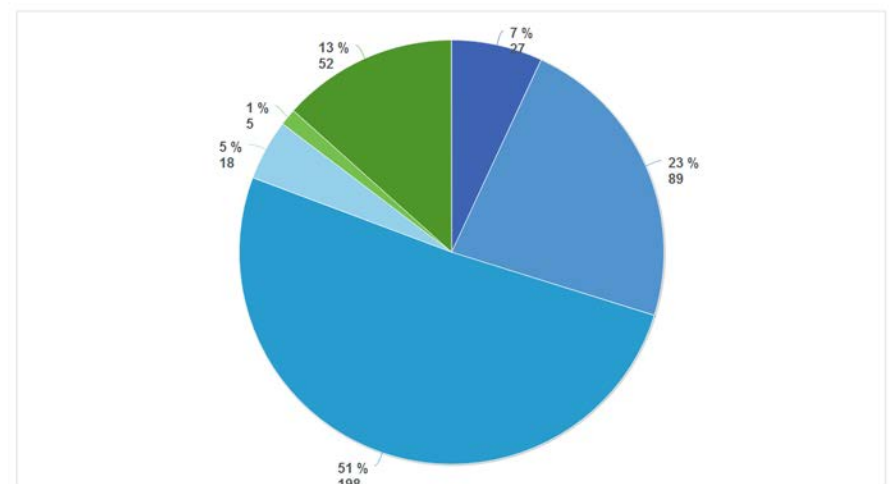


UCSC Spanish Studies BA Graduates Academic Plans for Graduate studies

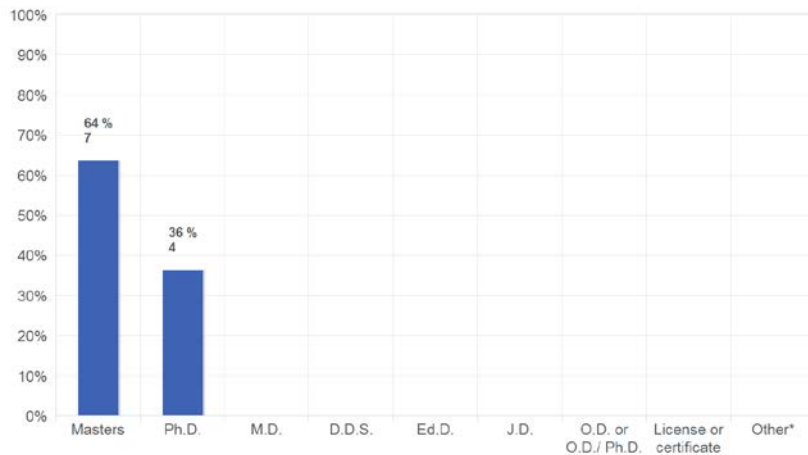

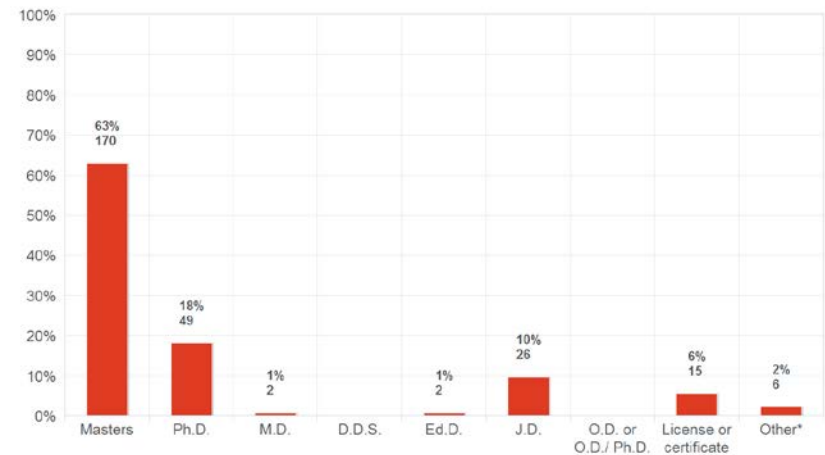
A vast majority (85%) of Spanish Studies BA graduates had plans to pursue graduate education.

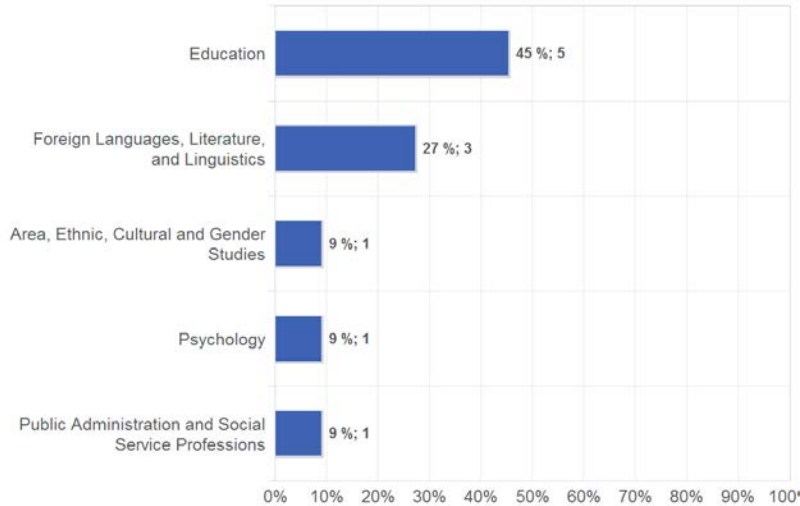

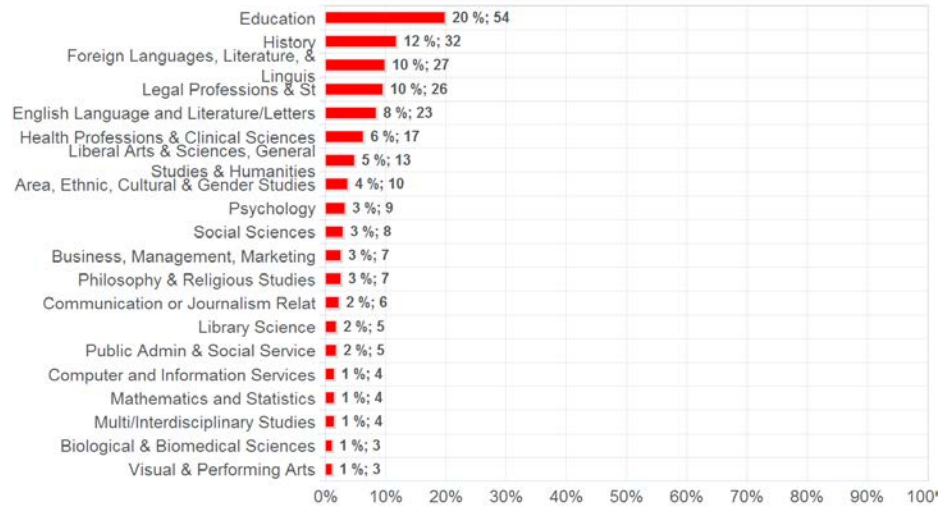
The majority (64%) of graduates with a Spanish Studies BA planned to obtain a Masters degree.

Most Popular Field of Future Academic Study



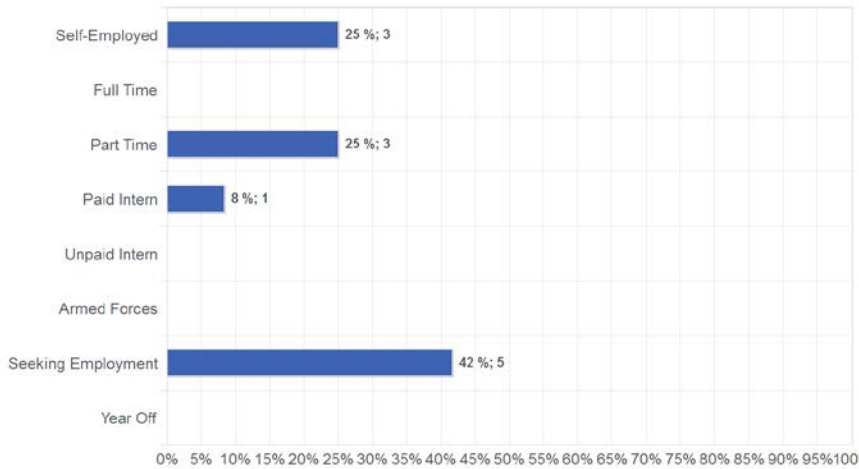

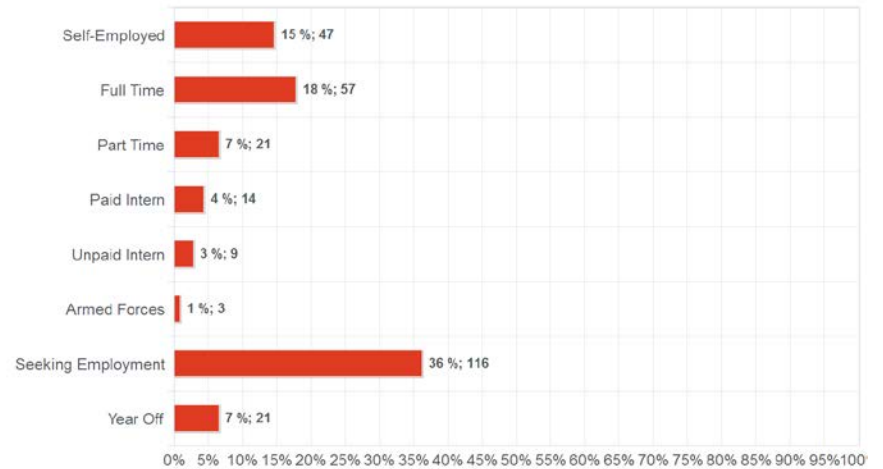
About half (45%) of Spanish Studies BA graduates were interested pursuing a postgraduate degree in Education.

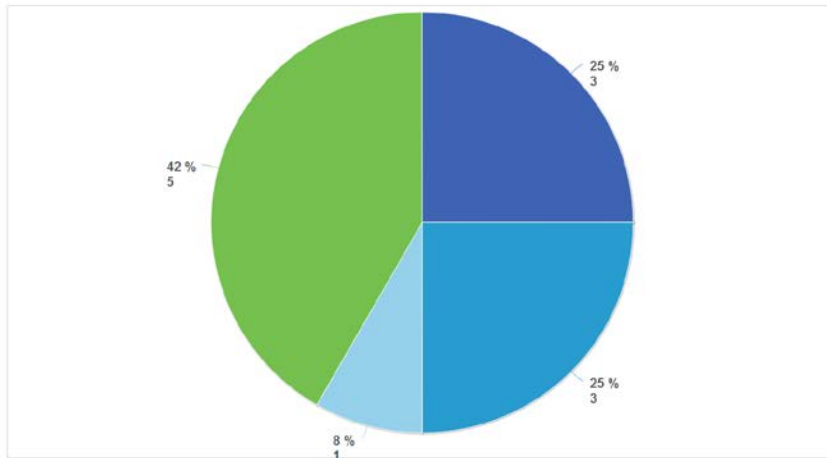
Over half (58%) of graduates with a BA degree in Spanish Studies reported being employed within 6 months of graduation.



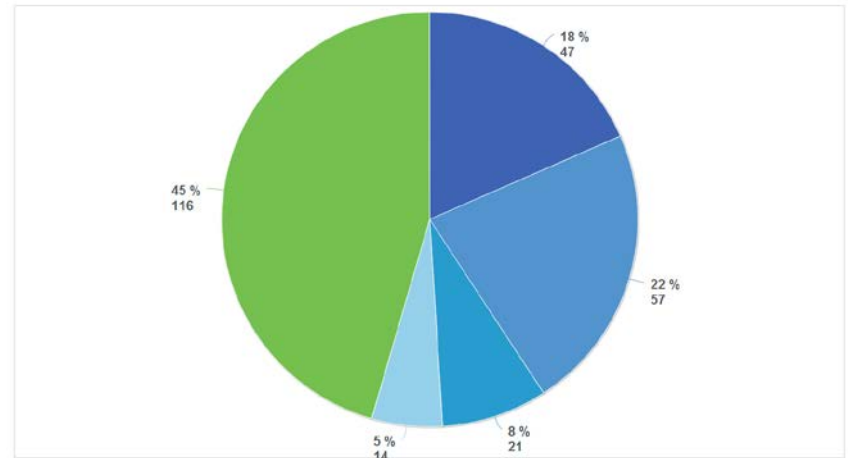

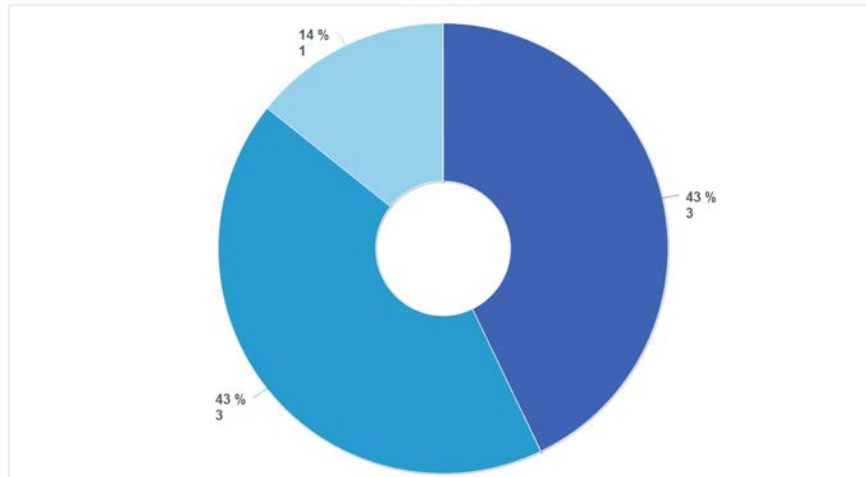

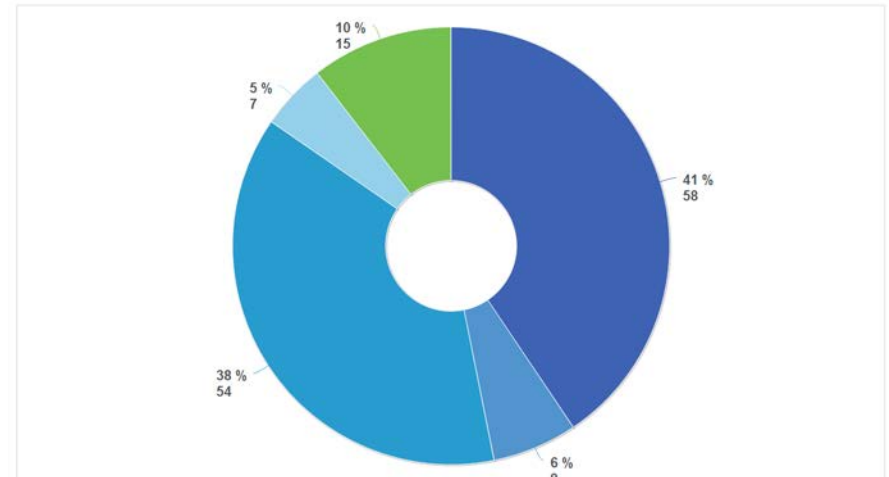


Six months after graduation, more Spanish Studies BA graduates were employed than were seeking employment.

Of those employed, the vast majority (86%) of Spanish Studies BA graduates reported working in the Business or Education sector within 6 months of graduation.

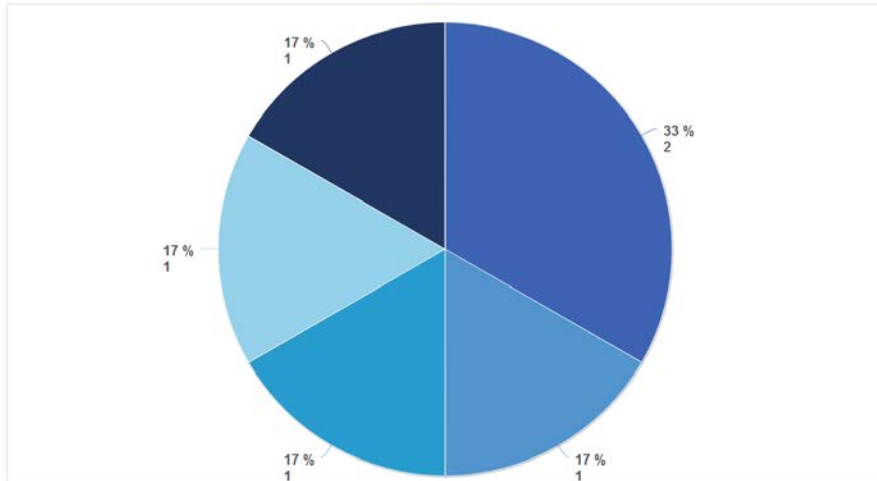

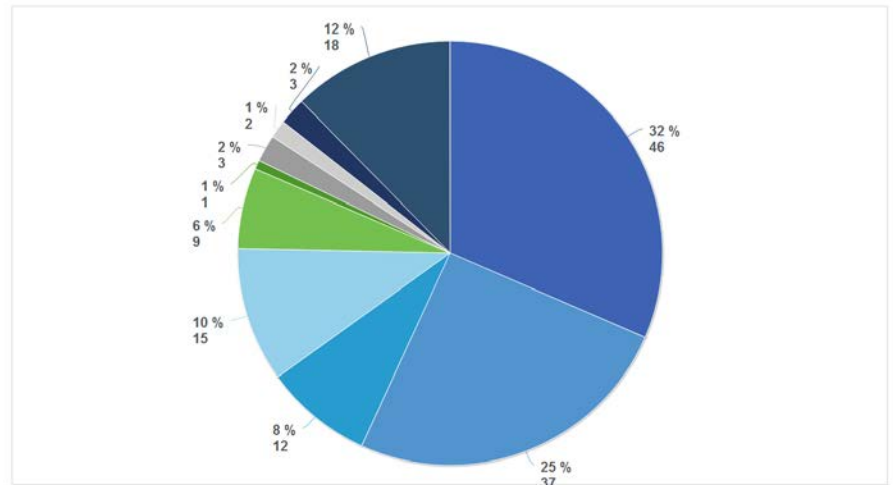

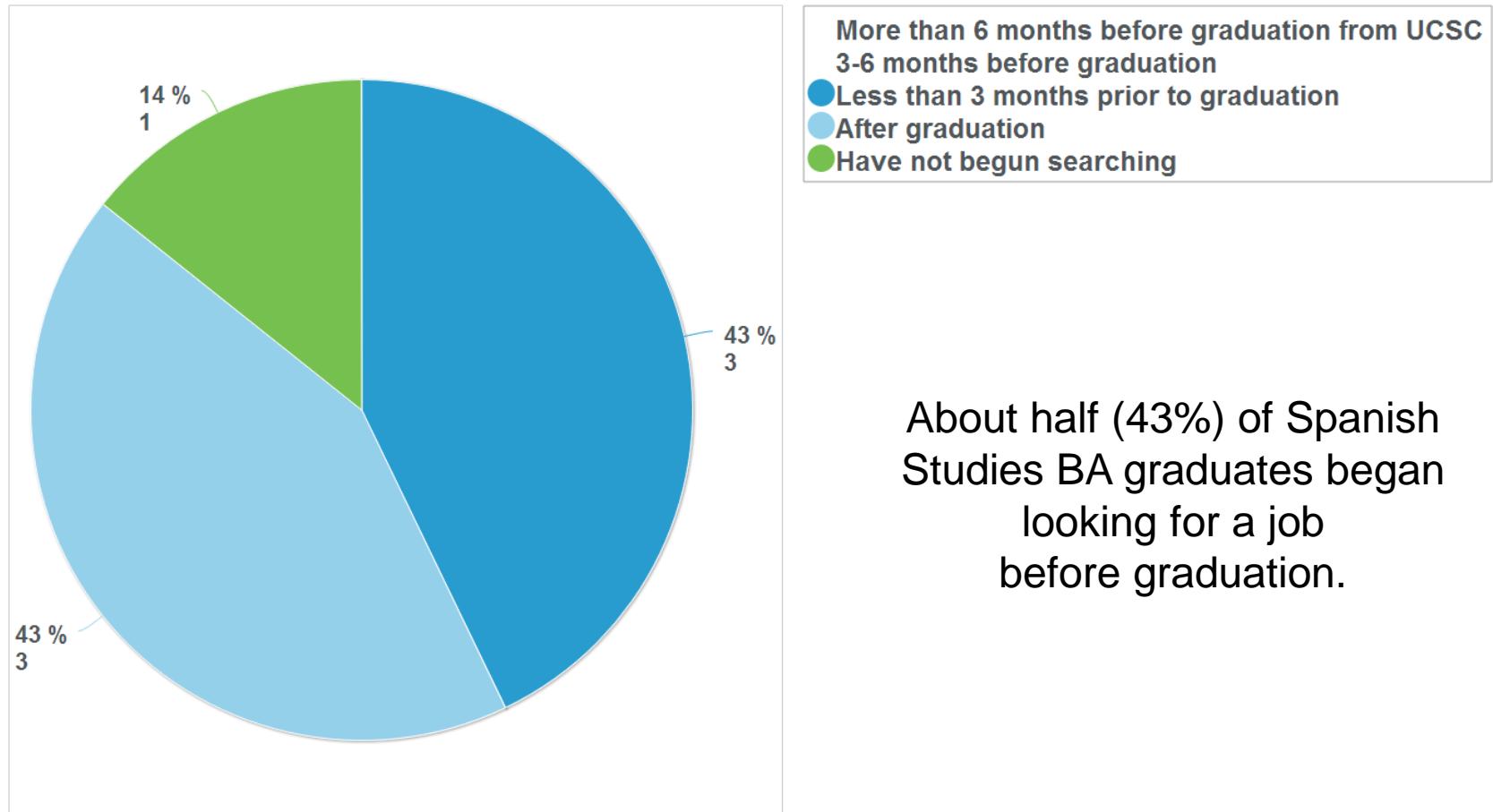
Half (50%) of Spanish Studies BA graduates plan to work in the Santa Cruz or San Francisco Bay areas.

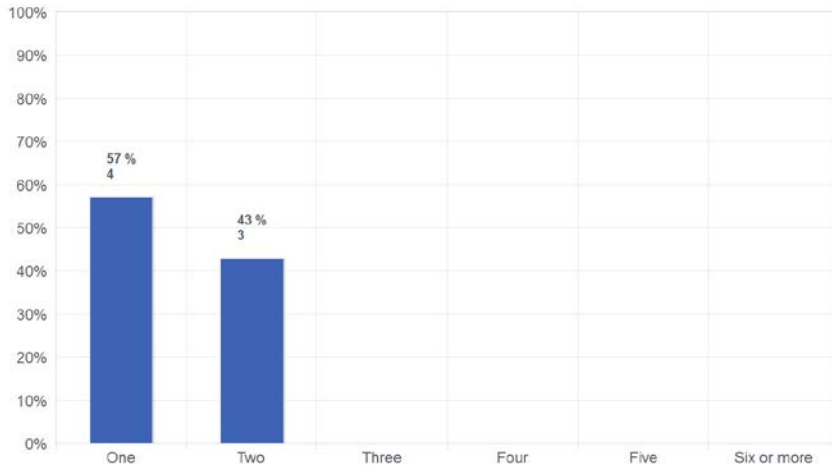
When did they start looking for a job? (employed & seeking employment)



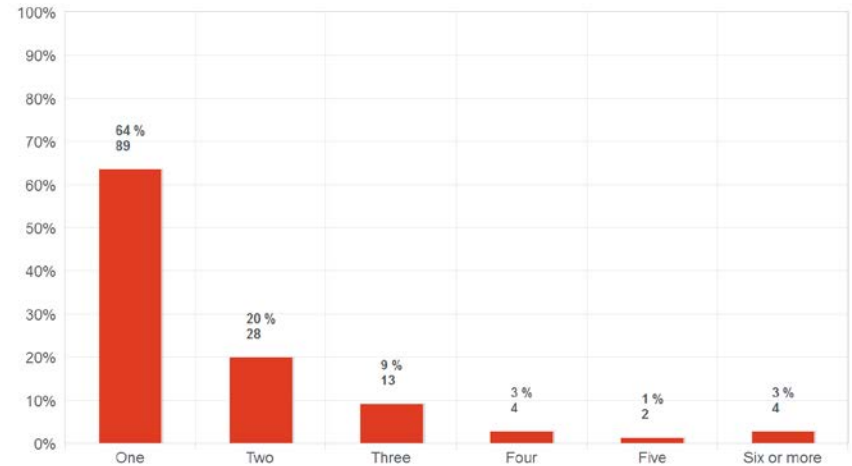
About half (43%) of Spanish Studies BA graduates began looking for a job before graduation.

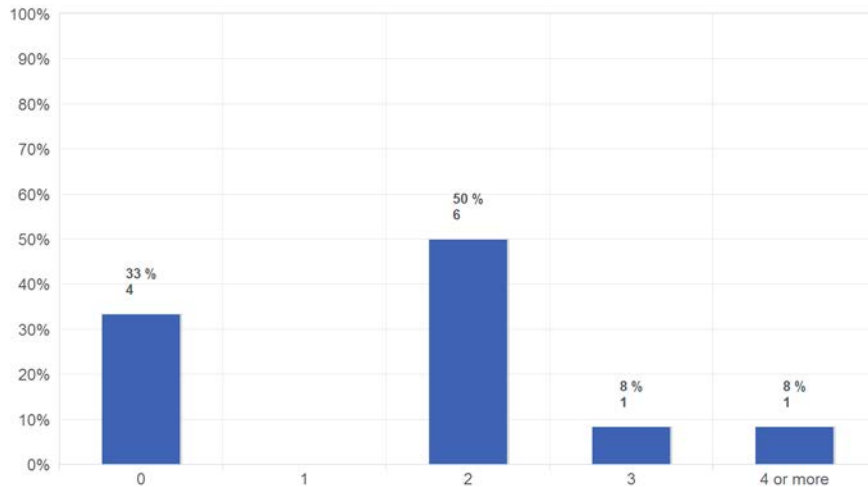
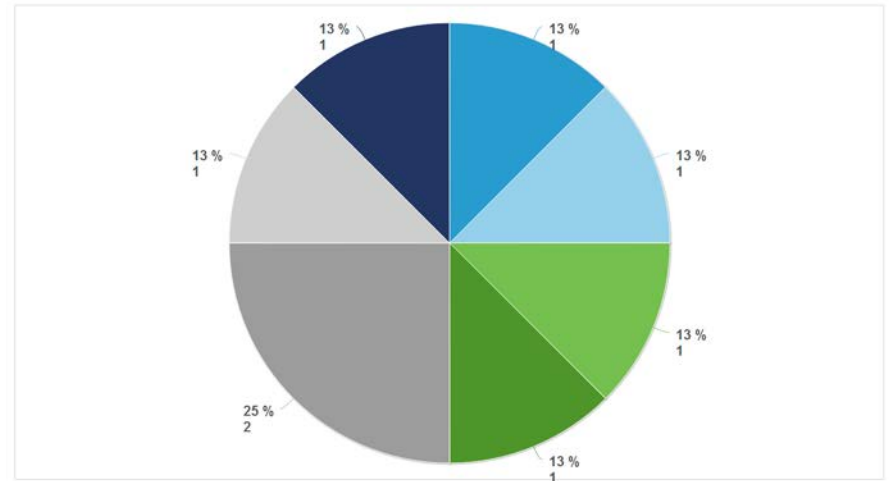


Humanities Division (excluding Spanish Studies Major)

UCSC Spanish Studies BA Graduates Internships

Over one-third (38%) of graduates reported that they found their internship by using UCSC resources – the UCSC Career Center Fair and networking through UCSC contacts.
